Summary: Extension specialists and Master Gardeners will have a booth at the Gallatin Valley Farmers' Market to answer plant, insect, disease and gardening questions.

BOZEMAN - Montana State University Extension specialists and Master Gardeners will be at a booth at the Gallatin Valley Farmers' Market at the Gallatin County Fairgrounds Saturday, July 10, to help answer questions about weeds, insects, diseases and other general yard and garden issues.

Bill Hoch, horticulture professor, and Linnea Skoglund, plant disease diagnostician, will be the guest specialists at the booth on July 10. The topic for the week will be trees and shrubs for the home landscape.

The specialists will also provide Extension fact sheets on related topics and free MontGuides, which are MSU Extension publications pertaining to yard and garden installation, plant selection, integrated pest management and other related topics.

Gardeners are also encouraged to bring plant and insect samples to the booth for diagnosis or identification, said Toby Day, Extension horticulturist and Master Gardener coordinator.

The Gallatin County Farmers' Market runs from 9 a.m. through noon on Saturdays through Sept. 11. There is no market on July 24.
