Description of IB Minor

The objectives of the International Business Minor are:

- To provide students a broad-based interdisciplinary educational experience that will enable students to succeed in a culturally diverse global business environment.
- To enable students to acquire the basic skills and knowledge necessary for a career in international business.
- To provide students a flexible yet rigorous program that suits each student's own individual needs and interests.

The minor requires 29 credits. Foreign language study is not required but is strongly recommended. Students are also strongly encouraged to go on exchange, do an internship with an international focus, and/or do an independent study that would allow the student to bring together in one research project the various international courses he or she has taken for the minor. *In accordance with Board of Regents Policy, a "C-" or better is required in each course to be counted toward the IB minor.*
