Janneke Hille Ris Lambers is the Doug and Maggie Walker Professor of Natural History at University of Washington. She is a plant community ecologist, broadly interested in: 1) the maintenance of species diversity and 2) how global change alters the structure and function of plant communities.

Her current research is focused on understanding the potential impacts of climate change on tree distributions, forest community structure, and wildflower phenology, which her lab largely conducts in the Cascade Mountains of Washington.
