Jamie Strange is a Research Entomologist with the USDA-ARS whose primary focus is bumble bee management and conservation. Jamie has broad research interests that focus on the effects of natural and anthropogenic change on pollinators and their symbionts. His work includes understanding the distributions and biology of bumble bee parasite, the use of bumble bees in agro-ecosystems, and the distribution and diversity of bumble bees. He frequently uses molecular biology and population genetic tools to investigate population health and to understand bumble bee ecology and evolution.
