

GRADUATE STUDENT OPENING IN Environmental Transmission of Chronic Wasting Disease

Applications are invited for a graduate student position at the MS level in the Infectious Disease Epidemiology of Animals Laboratory (www.epidiseaselab.org) at the University of Wyoming in Laramie. The expected start date is Fall semester 2020.

The position will be supervised by Associate Professor Brant Schumaker in the Department of Veterinary Sciences along with collaborators from the US Geological Survey and Wyoming Game and Fish Department. The graduate position will focus on potential sources of environmental transmission of Chronic Wasting Disease, especially artificial salt sites. The successful applicant will evaluate agricultural salt site mitigation and behavioral responses of cervids in response to mitigation.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will have:

1) At least a bachelor's degree in a relevant science field; 2) Keen interests in research on epidemiology, wildlife-livestock diseases, and disease ecology; 3) excellent academic skills demonstrated by excellent verbal and quantitative GRE scores, high grades in relevant coursework, and professional oral and written communications; 4) excellent interpersonal skills, enthusiasm, positive and flexible attitude, and ability to work independently as well as within a team atmosphere; 5) ability to critically evaluate information and data from various sources; 6) confidence and ability to interact with stakeholders from both wildlife and livestock backgrounds;

Additional desirable knowledge, skills, and abilities may include any of the following:

- Familiarity and experience with field methods such as camera trap deployment and image analysis;
- Quantitative analyses, statistics, or disease research (especially with regard to ungulates);

Review of applications will begin immediately, and will continue until a suitable candidate is identified.
