This is a remote site located in Tutka Bay Lagoon, across Kachemak Bay from Homer, Alaska. Tutka Bay Lagoon Hatchery produces ~100 million pink salmon fry annually. Job description:

Positions are full-time, seasonal positions. Under the direction of hatchery staff, fisheries technicians will work on a variety of projects that will include pink and sockeye salmon broodstock collection, eggtake, and incubation as well hatchery and equipment maintenance. Technicians may also be asked to operate small boats, water pumps, and hand and power tools. Work is often outside in any weather condition or inside around cold running water. Sound physical fitness is necessary due to the physical nature of the work. Employees live in communal dorm-style housing with shared kitchen and bathroom areas and must demonstrate the ability to live and work cooperatively and maintain cleanliness. Preferred candidates will have some scientific background.

Length of employment is approx. July 1 until September 3. We will also have several positions coming open from August 1 until October 30 as well. Qualified employees may be asked to stay longer.

Qualifications:

Candidates must have basic carpentry skills, sound physical fitness, ability to live respectfully with coworkers, ability to follow instructions, and a good attitude despite the weather or difficulty of the task. The use of hand tools, outboard motor and small skiff operation, and outdoor skills will be required. Familiarity with sampling and data recording techniques is desirable. The job requires the ability to lift and carry up to 50lbs as well as current CPR and First Aid certifications.
