The position **starts in May and runs through August**, and will collect both soil health and biodiversity data on ranches of the Yellowstone River between Gardiner, MT, and Livingston, MT, (Paradise Valley). Duties include, installing soil moisture stations, collecting soil health data, conducting vegetation plots, data management, equipment maintenance, public relations in rural communities, and safe decision-making.

Qualified applicants will typically have, or be working towards, B.S. in a natural science field and have experience working on western ranchlands habitats (sage brush, riparian, grasslands). Preference will also be given to applicants that have experience conducting vegetation plots. They should also have a valid driver's license and clean driving record, a positive attitude, strong field work background, experience with data entry and management, and excellent teamwork skills (work days are long, and shared employee housing is in close quarters).
