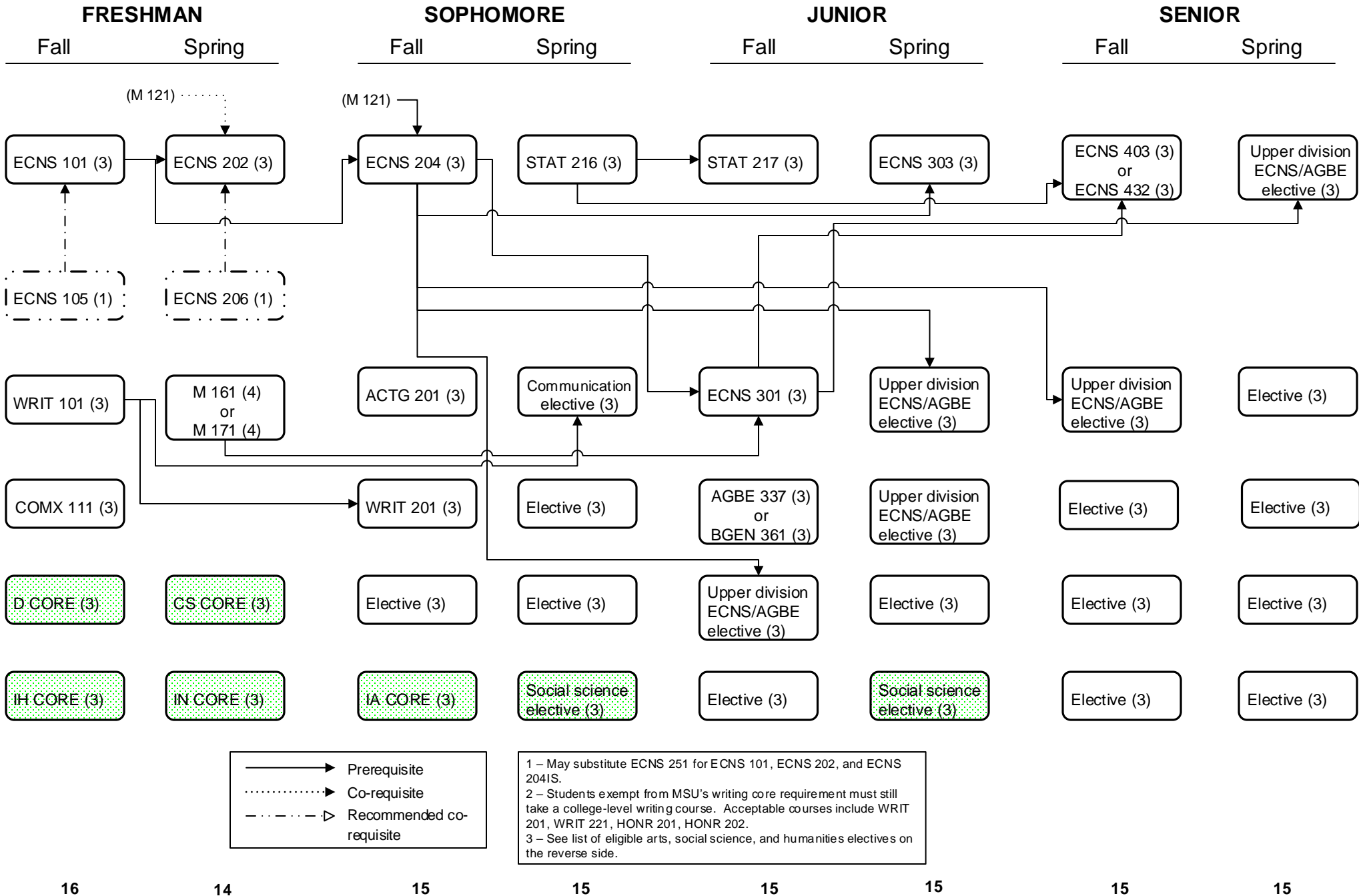

Mathematics (non-teaching) ¹	M 172, M 221, M 273, M 274, and three qualifying M courses. ²
<i>1: Strongly recommended if considering graduate school in economics.</i>	
<i>2: Any 300 or above M courses would count toward satisfying Econ. major upper-division elective requirement.</i>	
Business Administration	ACTG 202, BFIN 322, BMKT 325, and BMGT 335. ¹
<i>1: BFIN 322, BMKT 325, and BMGT 335 would count toward satisfying Econ. major upper-division elective requirement.</i>	
Finance	BMIS 211, ACTG 202, BFIN 322, BFIN 357 ¹ , and two qualifying BFIN courses. ²
<i>1: Student who pass ECNS 313 with a C- or better may substitute BFIN 357 for another qualifying BFIN course.</i>	
<i>2: Any 300 or above BFIN courses would count toward satisfying Econ. major upper-division elective requirement.</i>	
Political Science (non-teaching)	PSCI 201, PSCI 210IS, PSCI 230D, PSCI 240, PSCI 250, and three qualifying PSCI courses. ^{1,2}
<i>1: Completing this minor would fulfill CORE 2.0 IS and D and social science/humanities electives requirements.</i>	
<i>2: Any 300 or above PSCI courses would count toward satisfying Econ. major upper-division elective requirement.</i>
