This major includes Teaching Minors in History and Government. See TEPP forms for details. Students pursuing this major are encouraged to pursue a Teaching Minor.

A minimum of 128 credits is required for graduation. Forty-two (42) of these credits must be in courses numbered 300 and above.

If adding a Teaching Minor, you should expect to take more than 128 credits to complete the program.

Prior to student teaching placement students must meet all requirements listed above, have a "C" or better in all professional and content courses and have a 2.75 GPA in all areas listed above in the GPA & Credit Totals box.
