Chair Neumeier called the meeting to order at 4:10 pm, and a quorum was present. He would like next week's meeting for regular business; the week following will be a closed meeting.

Announcements - Chair Neumeier

- The progress of Romney renovation/space issues will be communicated to those senators who made inquiries.
- Provost Potvin offered to attend FS to answer questions about resources as related to growth. Chair Neumeier will schedule a
 time for those discussions the week after spring break.
- A shared governance forum will be conducted Friday, 2:00, Herrick Hall 117.
- Senators are frequently requested to become members on university committees. As this is sometimes burdensome, other
 options would like to be explored.

Draft Academic Items for Discussion and Vote - Chair-elect Mokwa

- Financial Engineering (revised Feb 2013)
 - New undergraduate major and minor
 - o Offered jointly via Ag Econ and Industrial Eng.
 - APWG addressed observations and concerns, and forwarded to the C&PC. They
 included the following:
 - Minor typos, which were corrected.
 - The term "Engineering" has connotations that are associated with accreditation. The committee met with the engineering board of professional licensor in Montana to discuss; the board was receptive and will write a letter of endorsement for the program.
 - It was recommended that the program include an ethics course, and has since been incorporated into it.
 - The program will impact other full-capacity courses, and implementation of additional resources will need to be considered.
 - Going forward, the Provost requested that a list of the specific new resources for new programs/courses be submitted.
 - Input from senate will go to Dean's Council, then to the BoR.

Common Hour Exams - Revised Document for Approval - Larry Carucci

- Extended time for students to get to an exam was clarified in Section 4.1.
- The newly proposed language includes limiting students to being a half an hour late to exams for conflicting events such as practice or meetings; notifying professors far in advance of conflicts; adding a Section 5 Students representing MSU and having it specifically noted in Section 4c, in parenthesis, as follows:
 - Are engaged in an activity or event sanctioned in paragraph 310.01 of the Student Conduct Code. (Official student representatives with a regularly scheduled practice or meeting that conflicts with a Common Hour Exam see point 5 below.)
- Senators will vote on the Common Hour and first section of the Course Credit policies via email.

Defining Course Credit Hours; Draft Policy for Discussion - Larry Carucci

- National legislation (Dept of Education via NWAAC) allows MSU to design a course credit hour policy.
- Faculty Affairs discussed two major points, among others:
 - Equivalency is on learning outcomes.
 - Senate discussed how to measure outcomes in a way that demonstrates what one has learned.
 - Lifetime learning.
 - Senate queried how it would be gauged.

- Knowledge and skills, an "effort" concept, might be included in language describing measurable outcomes as competency.
- Chair Neumeier would like senators to review the language, as posted on the FS website, provide input and Faculty Affairs will bring the policy back for a more in-depth discussion.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:00 pm.
