


The Broken Textbook Market



Higher Education Funding - U.S.



Textbook Costs Have Increased 1,000% Since the 1970s




Textbook costs increased 88 percent between 2006 and 2016, according to a report by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. | Getty Images




Sense of Belonging in the Classroom






TAA announces 2019 Textbook Award winners

Thirty-one textbooks have been awarded 2019 Textbook Awards by the Textbook & Academic Authors Association (TAA). Four textbooks received William Holmes McGuffey Longevity Awards, 17 textbooks received Textbook Excellence Awards, and ten textbooks received Most Promising New Textbook Awards.

The McGuffey Longevity Award recognizes textbooks and learning materials whose excellence has been demonstrated over time. The Textbook Excellence Award recognizes excellence in current textbooks and learning materials. The Most Promising New Textbook Award recognizes excellence in 1st edition textbooks and learning materials.



The awards will be presented during an awards reception at TAA's 32nd Annual Textbook & Academic Authoring Conference in Philadelphia, PA, June 14, 2019.

Blueprint for Success in College and Career is a remix of four previously existing OER (Open Educational Resources): A Different Road To College: A Guide For Transitioning To College For Non-traditional Students by Alise Lamoreaux, How to Learn Like a Pro! by Phyllis Nissila, Foundations of Academic Success: Words of Wisdom, edited by Thomas Priester, College Success, provided by Lumen Learning, and one previously copyrighted textbook with content that is now openly licensed: Blueprint for Success in College: Indispensable Study Skills and Time Management Strategies by Dave Dillon. A free OER, (Open Educational Resource), Blueprint for Success in College and Career is a students' guide for classroom and career success. This text, designed to show how to be successful in college and in career preparation focuses on study skills, time management, career exploration, health, and financial literacy.

MyOpenMath

Free, open source, online course management system for mathematics and other quantitative fields

LibreTexts

Contains resources for thirteen subject areas, and its content has been adopted for more than 150 courses.

From 2019-2022, OER has saved over **9,600** MSU student **\$1,513,976** in textbook costs

- Clarifications and minor edits
- Added definitions of Sustained Effectiveness in Teaching, Research, and Service
 - Sustained effectiveness in teaching is consistent successful performance over time and across course offerings and different student populations as a range of duties appropriate to the faculty member's appointment.
 - Sustained effectiveness in service is consistent successful performance over time and across a range of duties appropriate to the faculty member's appointment.
 - Sustained effectiveness in integration is consistent successful performance over time and across a range of duties appropriate to the faculty member's appointment.


New definition of Review Period

- Review Period is the period of performance to be considered for review. The review period for
 retention and tenure begins on the first day of employment in a tenurable position at the university and
 ends on the deadline established by the provost for submission of dossiers. If a candidate is hired with
 credit for years of service at a prior institution, the tenure review period includes the time of prior
 service specified in the letter of hire. The review period for promotion to professor is the period of
 employment at MSU in the rank of Associate Professor plus the time the candidate's tenure dossier was
 under review until submission deadline for the candidate's MSU tenure review or date of hire,
 whichever is later, to the deadline established by the provost for submission of the dossier for
 promotion to the rank of professor.
- Green = original proposed edit
- Red= revised proposed edit

New definition of Review Period- Clean view

• Review Period is the period of performance to be considered for review. The review period for retention and tenure begins on the first day of employment in a tenurable position at the university and ends on the deadline established by the provost for submission of dossiers. If a candidate is hired with credit for years of service at a prior institution, the tenure review period includes the time of prior service specified in the letter of hire. The review period for promotion to professor is the period of employment at MSU in the rank of Associate Professor plus the time the candidate's tenure dossier was under review until the deadline established by the provost for submission of the dossier for promotion to the rank of professor.

- The definition of Student changed
 - Changed to refer to the definition in the revised student code of conduct



In addition, the Faculty Senate acknowledges the extent to which MSU faculty already contribute unacknowledged, uncompensated, and unsupported emotional labor as first contacts with students' mental health challenges. The Senate further acknowledges the intensive efforts and positive impacts of Counseling and Psychological Services, the MSU Mental Health Task Force, and many other MSU offices involved in supporting mental health on campus. In support of these efforts, and to facilitate further prioritizing student, faculty, and staff mental health, the Senate therefore calls on MSU administration to

- 1. More clearly communicate to the MSU community the scope and scale of mental health challenges MSU is experiencing.
- 2. Regularly report to the MSU community the budgetary resources available to meet these difficulties, and efforts MSU is making to expand resources to meet student and faculty mental health needs; and
- 3. Commit additional resources to help faculty and staff negotiate supporting student mental health



 - i. We are no longer offering this course.



 - i. Per Craig Ogilvie: As a disciplinary course it should not be managed by the graduate school, learning outcomes, instructor etc. These should be in a dept. MIE already has an EMEC 424 and an EMEC 524 which are co-convened.
- MB 560 : Infectious Disease Ecology & Spillover
 - i. Instructor no longer with MSU.
- NEUR 528: Molecular Basis of Neurological Diseases
 - i. Instructor no longer with MSU.
