- o MSU has about 40 doctoral programs
- o Administrative prioritization already underway at MSU in the form of shared services (for IT, human resources, business processes)
- o Ultimate outcome/goal is to improve doctoral (PhD, EdD, DNP) program portfolio
- o Committee timeline: 1 year from Nov 2017
- Dean Hoo has reached out to universities that have gone through an academic prioritization for support/best practices
- Doctoral program prioritization committee (DPPC) plan to hold charrettes in February for campus feedback/information
- o DPPC meeting tomorrow, 2/1/18

• 2018-2019 PhD Enhancement Awards

- o Proposals in UGC shared drive for review
- o 24 requests for funding from 12 different PhD programs
- o \$18K per award; a program can request up to 2 awards
- o There is funding for 12 students
- o Ad-hoc committee: Livingston, Giullian, Al-Kaisy, Versland, Becker, Shreffler-Grant
