#### Human Resources (HR)

What she cares about: "Are you a cultural fit for our company?"

The HR person handles your application, resume and schedules your visit. She can answer pay and benefits questions.

Impress her by: being on time, respectful and professional



#### Worker/Technician

What he cares about: "do I look good in front of the boss?"

He does not care about you because he is busy with his job. Be brief, ask no hard questions

Impress him by: Don't make him look bad in front of the boss



#### Mechanical Engineer

What he cares about: "Would I want you on my team?"

Charismatic corporate clown that you will be introduced to even though he is not an interviewer. He sets the bar for the culture.

Impress him by: Be personal and look for common interests



#### Director of Engineering

What he cares about: "What are you skills/talents and how can they help me"

No fluff. Do NOT bullshit this person! He is busy and eager to get your help.

Impress him by: Ask him what he does (before he asks you!) and tell him how your skills/talents can help him



General Manager (aka the BOSS)

What he cares about: "Are you enthusiastic to be a part of our team?"

Sees the big "corporate picture" and knows stuff you never will know or care about. TIP: ask him about how you can grow your new position!

Impress him by: Be enthusiastic about this job



#### Engineering Manager


What he cares about:
"What exactly are you skills and talents so I know where you go.
Are you trainable?"

This is the guy you are actually going to work for and the one you need to impress with your skills and talents.


Impress him by: Be honest and upfront with you skills and talents (without bragging). Be someone he can work with.

You do NOT have to know what all this stuff is so enjoy the tour. Look for a few things you may recognize.








