CREATIVE ACTIVITY

Inuulluataarnek Film Project. A series of socially and culturally relevant vignettes is in development for *Inuulluataarnek*. The film project consists of 10 vignettes. The use of vignettes will enhance the visibility of CBPR in Greenland through culturally relevant dissemination pathways. Each of the vignettes will be a short educational video. The vignettes will touch on one of the following subjects: 1) A description of CBPR; 2) Sexually transmitted infections and sexual health in Greenland; 3) Sexual decision-making, communication, and condom use skills in sexual relationships; and 4) Topics related to the importance of trust, confidence and self worth in sexual relationships. The film vignettes builds on *Inuulluataarnek's* current research which suggests that Greenlanders need more tools in order to develop their own strategies concerning knowledge regarding STIs and how to be sexually healthy, increased education in sexual negotiation skills including communicating about sex and condom use, as well as how to establish trust in a sexual relationship. There is also a need for education in the professional health and academic community in Greenland on CBPR methodologies. The target audience for the CBPR vignette is health professionals, academics and with a strong focus on the local communities. Fort Peck Men's Sexual Health Film Project – Warrior's Heart. The purpose of the healthy relationships film project is to document male-female relationship characteristics among Native Americans. The focus of the film is the components of healthy male-female relationships and the different kinds of intimate relationships that Native American men may experience throughout their lifetime. The themes addressed in the film relate to cultural and social perspectives that influence male-female relationships among Native Americans, communication styles in relationships, courtship styles, how couples make decisions about birth control and condom use and pregnancy, conflict resolution strategies, and generational differences in attitudes towards male-female relationships. An important element of the film is to depict a realistic view of male-female relationships that addresses both the strengths and the challenges of being in intimate relationships.
