WZ Technician Certification will be given to those who have 2,000 hours of WZ experience and successfully pass the course.
- •Flagging duties and responsibilities will be taught. Safety, uniformity and liability issues will also be covered.

Who Should Attend: Road department employees from cities, counties, MDT, Forest Service and Park Service, as well as BIA and Tribal employees will all benefit from attending this workshop.

Instructor: Montana LTAP Director Steve Jenkins, P.E., obtained his Master's degree in Geotechnical Engineering. He also directed Utah LTAP and MT TTAP. For over 20 years, Steve has instructed Flagging Certification and other work zone courses. His involvement has been with local and tribal governments.
