Introduction:

Palestine is one of the oldest inhabited countries in the world. In the last one hundred years, they have undergone a dramatic shift in power and loss of freedom. Palestine has been subject to persecution and harassment, forced to give up their land for the settlement of Israel. Today, there are few attempts towards the construction of peaceful interactions (Daveid 2012).

Hypothesis Tested:

Development of activities engaging Israeli and Palestinian children together will promote mutual acceptance and appreciation of cultural diversity.

Materials and Methods:

We wanted to get in touch with one Refugee Camp in Palestine, however, due to the strict security and power of the Israelis, we were unable to communicate with them. Our next plan was to email Palestinians who have moved to surrounding Arab countries. We had three in-depth interviews with people who have lived in Palestine. Out of 23,335 journal articles (in Table 1), we have used 6 thus far in our research.
