## Scholarships awarded through Montana State University

<u>Montana American Indian Tuition Waiver:</u> The Montana Tuition waiver is available to eligible Montana resident freshman and transfer students. Students must be a resident of Montana, 1/4 American Indian or be an enrolled member of a state or federally recognized tribe located in the state of Montana (proof of enrollment or affiliation is required), and demonstrate financial need through FAFSA.

<u>Tribal Homelands Scholarship:</u> The Tribal Homeland Scholarship is open to eligible non-resident Native American new freshmen and transfer students who are interested in attending MSU and whose tribal affiliation once called the Montana area their "Homelands." Students must file FAFSA and have documentation of tribal affiliation or enrollment submitted to the MSU Office of Financial Aid. A pre-determined list of eligible tribes is available on the attached link.

McNair Scholars Program: This program is a student support program assisting qualified students in their quest to obtain a graduate degree, primarily the PhD degree. Once a student is accepted into the program they are eligible for monetary awards given as stipends for student research, are able to travel to conferences and graduate school visits, are required to participate in the GRE workshop and are eligible to receive information as to how to apply and be accepted to graduate school. Scholarships available for underrepresented minority students, low income and first generation college students. Students must be a full time undergraduate student at MSU with a 2.75 GPA (preferably 3.0 GPA) and have completed 60 credits before beginning the summer research/project. Must be a citizen or permanent resident of the USA. Deadline: October 18th.

<u>Pramila K. Tummala Memorial Scholarship</u>: The Pramila K. Tummala Memorial Scholarship is available at MSU to incoming freshman or transfer students. Tribal enrollment or CIB (Certificate of Indian Blood), official college or high school transcript, good academic standing, personal essay (not to exceed 4 pages), and two letters of recommendation are required to apply. Amount awarded: \$1,000. Deadline: August 1st.

<u>Hedwig Arlen Memorial Scholarship</u>: The Hedwig Arlen Memorial Scholarship is available to incoming Native American freshman or transfer students who have declared one of the programs in the College of Arts and Architecture as their major. Deadline: June 16, 2014

<u>FAFSA:</u> The Free Application for Federal Student Aid gives grants, loans, and work-study money for students with financial need. Fill this form out after January 1, but before March 1 of the year you are to begin attending Montana State University

<u>EMPower:</u> The College of Engineering, through the Engineering Minority Program (EMPower) offers scholarships for incoming freshman Native students. Be sure to sure send in the application before the February 1 deadline.

<u>Academic Scholarships:</u> (for new MSU Students) Montana State University offers millions of dollars in scholarships for Resident and Non-Resident students.

MSU Office of Financial Aid: The Office of Financial Aid assists students with their need based awards, FAFSA and other financial aid questions.

<u>Alice Willman Cassidy Endowment:</u> The Dean of the College will allocate available spendable income for one or more of the following purposes listed in the order of priority:

- 1) Scholarships for Native American nursing students with preference to those students participating in the CO-OP Program
- 2) To provide monthly stipends to Native American nursing students in the CO-OP Program

Robert Raskind Nursing Scholarship: American Indian student enrolled in the graduate nursing program. Preference for candidates with demonstrated commitment to & involvement in the American Indian community within Montana. Graduates of St. Labre School will be given preference over equally qualified applicants. The scholarship is intended to cover a recipient's full period of graduate study leading to a Masters Degree in Nursing. Provided the recipient maintains satisfactory progress, the award is renewable for full time study toward completion of the degree. If there are no qualified candidates, then the College of Nursing may

award/use fund's resources to provide undergraduate scholarships for Native American students, or graduate nursing scholarships.

The Scholarship is intended to foster advanced practice nursing education for American Indians who are committed to improving the health of Indians and to serve as role models and advocates for the American Indian Community.
