Provide leadership for the day-to-day operations of MSU Extension. Supervise and support the campus-based units of MSU Extension including Communications, Publications, and Technology; the Local Government Center; Fire Service Training School; Nutrition Education; REAL Montana; the Weatherization Center; and all non-departmentalized academic Extension faculty - Forestry and Community Health.

INTERIM DIRECTOR, MONTANA 4-H CENTER FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT - ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR AND STATE PROGRAM LEADER - MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION (September '12 – June '14) Major responsibilities include providing innovative leadership and direction for the development, implementation, and evaluation

of statewide 4-H Youth Development programs. Work collaboratively with extension professionals, volunteer leaders, and youth to maintain the integrity and relevancy of the Montana 4-H program. Provide statewide leadership for the development of goals, vision, and direction of program components. Provide leadership for administrative functions of the 4-H Center and programs including budget development and management, supervision of faculty and staff, and internal and external communication regarding 4-H Youth Development.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, 4-H VOLUNTEER AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT SPECIALIST - MONTANA 4-H CENTER FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT, MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION (August '05 – August '12) Major responsibilities include providing innovative leadership and direction for the development, implementation, and evaluation of statewide volunteer and leadership development programs. Provide statewide leadership for a comprehensive volunteer plan for Montana 4-H which includes the development of policies, procedures, training, and professional development. Coordinate statewide youth and adult leadership development programs including the Montana 4-H Ambassadors, Montana 4-H Council, Montana 4-H Leadership Forum, and Collegiate 4-H. Provide statewide leadership for 4-H risk management. Serve as the Instructor for EDCI 588 – Foundations of Positive Youth Development and lead instructor/coordinator for the Montana 4-H Leaders' College.

REGIONAL PROGRAM DIRECTOR - 4-H AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT, TEXAS COOPERATIVE EXTENSION, WEST REGION (September '03 – July '05) Major responsibilities include providing leadership for Extension education programs in the area of 4-H and Youth Development for the West Region (Districts 6, 7 & 10 - 67 Counties). Provide overall regional leadership and vision for the development, implementation, evaluation and interpretation of 4-H and Youth programs. Provide input into the selection, annual program plan development and performance appraisal of Extension agents.
