PART 1 – GENERAL

1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

 - A. Product Data: For each type of product indicated.
 - B. Shop Drawings (If requested by Owner): For each type of floor tile. Include floor tile layouts, edges, columns, doorways, enclosing partitions, built-in furniture, cabinets and cutouts.
 - C. Samples: Full-size units of each color and pattern of floor tile required.
 - D. Maintenance data.
- 1.4 QUALITY ASSURANCE
 - A. Fire-Test-Response Characteristics: As determined by testing identical products according to ASTM E 648 or NEPA 253 by a qualified testing agency.
 - 1. Critical Radiant Flux Classification: Class I, not less than 0.45 W/sq. cm.
 - B. 15 year Commercial Limited Warranty with Commercial 15 year underbed bond warranty

1.5 PROJECT CONDITIONS

- A. Close spaces to traffic during floor time installation.
- B. Close spaces to traffic for 48 hours after floor tile installation.
- PART 2 PRODUCTS
- 2.1 LUXURY VINYL FLOORING TILE, wood pattern in common areas
 - A. Manufacturers: Subject to compliance with requirements, available manufacturers offering products that may be incorporated into the Work include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Shaw Contract Solitude Collection, to match existing
- 2. Bidders attention is called to section 5 of the Instructions to Bidders, which requires requests for substitutions to the basis of design be submitted at least ten days before bid for consideration.
- B. Tile Standard Classification: ASTM F1700, Class 3, Type B, printed film vinyl plank.
- C. Construction: Heavy Commercial Luxury Vinyl Tile with Fiberglass
- D. Wearlayer Thickness: minimum 20 mils or .020" (0.51 mm).
- E. Overall Thickness: 0.197 inches
- F. Size: 6" Wide by 48" Long.
- G. Colors and Patterns: As selected by Architect/Engineer from manufacturer's full range of standard products.
- 2.3 INSTALLATION MATERIALS
 - A. Trowelable Leveling and Patching Compounds: Latex-modified, Portland cement based or blended hydraulic-cement-based formulation provided or approved by manufacturer for applications indicated.
 - B. Adhesives:
 - 1. Standard adhesive: type recommended by manufacturer. Basis of design: Shaw 5100 resilient adhesive.
 - C. Floor Polish: Not in Contract. Floor polishing to be provided by Owner.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.1 PREPARATION

- A. Prepare substrates according to manufacturer's written instructions to ensure adhesion of resilient products.
- B. Concrete Substrates: Prepare according to ASTM F 710.
 - 1. Verify that substances are dry and free of curing compounds, sealers, and hardeners.
 - 2. Remove substrate coatings and other substances that are incompatible with adhesives and that contain soap, wax, oil, or silicone, using mechanical methods recommended by manufacturer. Do not use solvents.
- C. Fill cracks, holes, and depressions in substrates with trowelable leveling and patching compound and remove bumps and ridges to produce a uniform and smooth substrate.

- D. Do not install floor tiles until they are same temperature as space where they are to be installed.
 - 1. Move resilient products and installation materials into spaces where they will be installed at least 48 hours in advance of installation.
- DI. Sweep and vacuum clean substrates to be covered by resilient products immediately before installation.

3.2 FLOOR TILE INSTALLATION

A. Comply with manufacturer's written instructions for installing floor tile.

B. Lay out floor tiles from center marks established with principal walls, discounting minor offsets, so tiles at opposite edges of room are of equal width. Adjust as necessary to avoid using cut widths that equal less than one-half tile at perimeter.

1. Lay tiles square with room axis, unless otherwise directed by Owner.

C. Match floor tiles for color and pattern by selecting tiles from cartons in the same sequence as manufactured and packaged, if so numbered. Discard broken, cracked, chipped, or deformed tiles.

1. Lay tiles with grain direction alternating in adjacent tiles (basket-weave pattern), unless otherwise directed by Owner.

D. Scribe, cut, and fit floor tiles to butt neatly and tightly to vertical surfaces and permanent fixtures including built-in furniture, cabinets, pipes, outlets, and door frames.

E. Extend floor tiles into toe spaces, door reveals, closets, and similar openings. Extend floor tiles to center of door openings or to transition strip (where occurring).

F. Adhere floor tiles to flooring substrates using a full spread of adhesive applied to substrate to produce a completed installation without open cracks, voids, raining and puckering at joints, telegraphing of adhesive spreader marks, and other surface imperfections.

3.3 CLEANING AND PROTECTION

- A. Comply with manufacturer's written instructions for cleaning of floor tile.
- B. Floor Polish: Not in Contract. Floor polishing to be provided by Owner.
