Economics in the 2024 Presidential Election

This seminar course explores the economics of the policy positions of the 2024 presidential candidates on major issues ranging from climate to immigration to health care and beyond. Discussions will be led by faculty and experts from the Department of Agricultural Economics and Economics.

The class will also explore the role of political and economic institutions in Democracy by reading and discussing one chapter from the book "Why Nations Fail" by Daron Acemoglu and James A. Robinson.

About the Instructor: Dr. Wendy Stock is a professor of economics and director of the Initiative for Regulation and Applied Economic Analysis (IRAEA) at Montana State University. She also conducts research in economics education, is the author of an introductory-level economics textbook, and serves as Associate Editor of the Journal of Economic Education.
