### Champ Change Readers Across Campus



Some have asked about what Champ Change does and how it works. Here goes:

There are Champ Change readers all across campus, and you can swipe your Cat Card at each one daily accumulating points. [Here are their locations](#) and the points you collect at each one.

At the end of the semester, there is an auction (usually online) where you cash in points for items from water bottles all the way to a \$1,000 tuition waiver. TRIO scholars have gotten this tuition waiver several times, but it's work. You need at least 200,000 points most times. There are other big prizes such as TVs, microwaves, game systems, paddleboards, and a lot of smaller, useful things.

### Weatherly Memorial Lecture Confronting Sexual Violence in Native America

Sarah Deer (Muscogee (Creek) Nation) has worked to end violence against women for over 25 years and was named a MacArthur Fellow in 2014. Her scholarship focuses on the intersection of federal Indian law and victims' rights. Prof. Deer is a co-author of four textbooks on tribal law. Her latest book is *The Beginning and End of Rape: Confronting Sexual Violence in Native America*, which has

received several awards. Her work on violence against Native women has received national recognition from the American Bar Association and the Department of Justice. She currently teaches at the University of Kansas. Professor Deer is also the Chief Justice for the Prairie Island Indian Community Court of Appeals.
