A. Interim Provost Update

Provost Fedock discussed the establishment of a culture of assessment program plan for Montana State University.

B. Faculty Senate Update

Dr. Wes Lynch discussed faculty concerns about the budgeting process and performance based funding. Associate Commissioner for Fiscal Affairs Mick Robinson will be attending the Faculty Senate meeting on September 15. President Cruzado encouraged Faculty Senate to invite the Deans to the Faculty Senate for this meeting. Dr. Lynch extended the invitation for the Deans to join them on September 15 at 4:00 pm. Faculty Senate is discussing their role in a unionized campus.

C. Professional Council Update

Ms. Betsey Pitts discussed the Council's desire to communicate to all staff their role in student success and retention. The Council produced a video that was distributed to everyone in Monday Morning Memo on August 30.

D. Staff Senate Update

Mr. William Van Horn discussed the implementation of a Public Relations Task Force to effectively communicate with classified staff. Staff Senate will be conducting a survey on the financial impact of the new prescription drug program.

E. ASMSU Update

F. Athletics Update

There will be more community events including pep rallies downtown on the following Fridays: September 3, September 24, October 8 and November 19.
