Catch FYRE...with a First Year Research Experience at MSU

Program Application Fall 2018

Program Description:

FYRE is an innovative new program designed to connect first-year students with hands-on research experiences in a variety of academic disciplines. Students selected for the FYRE program enroll in a 1-credit introductory research seminar and receive training and support to help them find research internships in MSU labs and scholarly research groups. Students selected for FYRE will receive funding to work as paid research assistants for up to one academic year.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must be first-year college students (<24 *earned* credit hours at time of application). AP credits do not count against program eligibility.
- Applicants must be enrolled full-time during AY 2018-19 (12 credits minimum).
- All academic majors are welcome to apply.
- Funding for the FYRE program is provided through a campus retention initiative. Selection criteria include availability and distribution of projects among academic disciplines and retention analytics.

How to Apply:

- Complete and return the FYRE application form (below) to **Gaines Hall, Room 130-J by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 31.**
- Review of application materials will begin promptly following the application deadline.
- Students will be notified by email of their application status by September 7.
