The music technology program at MSU integrates creative composition and audio engineering, with a particular emphasis on interdisciplinary collaboration: composition and sound design for film, video, theater and multimedia, content for broadcast media, and scientific applications in acoustics and audio signal processing. Music Technology classes address the changing environment of the music industry, providing students with the range of skills and experience they need to forge their own pathways in this constantly-changing field.

Music 115, Introduction to Digital Music, is designed to be the first course in the new Music Technology sequence. The class will cover concepts and terms, software and hardware, historical background, and an introduction to the music business. We will analyze trends in the music industry and assess tools for building self-directed careers within the changing field of music technology. Students will work on composition projects using Mac/PC software, written projects, and listening exercises. Time will be allotted for guest presentations and class discussions to address students' specific areas of interest.
