



Interdisciplinary Electives: 9 credits of electives outside of business, economics and agriculture business. any level (100-400). May not double count with University Core or lower-level business degree requirements (e.g. M 1210, STAT 2160, ECNS 101IS, etc.

Upper-Division Electives: 2 BMGT + 3 AAE




College Credit

 - Contact us when complete to update your schedule


