

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### **Net Cost**

### What is Net Cost?

- Estimated out of pocket expenses, or the remaining amount needed to cover the cost of attendance.
- Calculated by subtracting grants and scholarships from either the Cost of Attendance or Direct Costs.
- Also known as "the Gap."

### **Example (non-resident):**

• Direct Costs: \$48,452

Achievement Award: (\$15,000)

Outside Scholarship: (\$2,500)


• Pell Grant: (\$4,000)

• NET COST: \$26,952






# QuikPay

### The Student's Portal to:


- Make a Payment
  - Payments can be made by check, echeck, credit and debit cards (credit/debit cards will have a 2.85% fee)
- Set up a Payment Plan
- Manage Direct Deposit for Refunds
- Set up Authorized Payers
  - (not the same as FERPA)






In this portal you can:


- 1. Make a Payment on time

- 4. Understand the difference between the statement & current balance








# **Tuition Payment Plan**

# Confirm/Pay Bill Deadlines

### For Fall 2025

- Registered on or before July 31, 2025
  - Deadline: AUGUST 8, 2025
  - \$40 late fee after this date
- Registered on or after August 1, 2025
  - Deadline: AUGUST 27, 2025
  - \$40 late fee after this date
- ALL STUDENTS MUST TAKE ACTION TO BE CONFIRMED BY SEPTEMBER 10, 2025
  - Avoid cancellation of classes
  - Additional \$40 late fee


