#### The following is a brief summary of some requirements for the Master of Professional Accountancy program.

- 1. Maximum of 9 credit hours of approved 400-level course work may be included in the 30-credit MPAc program, if at least 6 of these 9 credit hours are ACTG or BFIN classes. Otherwise, 6 credit hours of approved 400-level course work may be included.
- Undergraduate seniors and non-degree graduate students may apply/reserve up to 9 credits of approved 400-level and/or 500-level course work toward their 30-credit MPAc program. For 400- level classes, the restriction in #1 above applies. Grades of "B" or higher (not "B-" or lower) must be earned.
- 3. Maximum of 3 pass/fail credits may be included in the 30-credit MPAc program.
- 4. Maximum of 9 credits of coursework taken at accredited schools other than MSU-Bozeman may be included in the 30 credit major program. ("B" minimum grade).
- 5. No 400, 470, 490, 492, 494, 498, 588 or 589 credits may be applied toward graduate degree requirements.

**GPA Requirements:** Graduate students must achieve at least a 3.0 grade point average each semester, maintain at least a 3.0 GPA in their <u>Program of Study</u>, **and** must maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA at all times. Students not meeting these requirements may be dropped from the graduate program. Grades of "C" or higher MUST be earned in all classes by MPAc students regardless of cumulative GPA (a "C-" or lower is considered to be a failing grade).

\*400-level courses may be used toward the 30-credit MPAc program requirements (see reverse), if not used as part of any other degree program; certain grade restrictions apply. Note that there may be additional courses in economics, statistics, and business software applications required to satisfy the pre-requisites for the background business courses listed above.

## Applicants with Non-Accounting Bachelor Degrees:

- Students who are not admissible to the MPAc program but are taking the required background courses to prepare for entrance into the MPAc program must be classified as <u>nondegree graduate students (NDGR</u>).
- Non-degree graduate students who have completed ACTG 201, ACTG 202 and ACTG 223 with a <u>combined GPA of 3.0</u> or better may qualify for the <u>pre-MPAc (NDAC)</u> designation. The NDAC designation allows you greater ease of registration in upper division ACTG courses and access to pre-MPAc advising. For more information and the NDAC application see:

- TOEFL or IELTS scores: required for international students only

Students desiring a CPA license from the State of Montana should contact the Montana State Board of Public Accountants for the requirements to sit for the CPA Exam as soon as possible in order to plan their class schedule. This worksheet is intended to assist students in designing their graduate program and is <u>not a required form</u>. A <u>Program of Study form must</u> be completed by each student within two months of enrollment in the MPAc program, and must be approved by the student's graduate committee, the MPAc Director, and the Dean of the Graduate School.
