Purpose of the COE Ambassadors

- To promote the College of Engineering to prospective students and their families.
- To inspire young people to pursue careers and opportunities in Engineering and Computer Science by educating high school/middle school students through outreach events
- To provide a voice for students in the college. (Representation with college advisory board, industry, etc.)
- To enhance retention by educating prospective students on the skills, classes and occupations involved in Engineering and Computer Science.

Expectations

- Maintain a 2.5 G.P.A.
- Attend bi-weekly meetings (no more than 3 absences) during the Fall/Spring semesters
- Promote all programs of the College of Engineering, including the skill sets needed, familiarity with curriculums, research projects, program achievements, industry connections and opportunities, etc.
- Represent the NACOE at recruiting and public relations events statewide.
- Commit to being available at least twice per month to give prospective engineering students a tour of the engineering facilities (offered each day at 1:10 pm).
- Available to assist in MSU Friday activities (attend presentations and lead tours).
- Communicate with prospective students, alumni, potential donors.

Time Demand

Estimated at 2 hours per week (meetings, tours, communication with prospective students, MSU Friday). The group meets biweekly on Wednesdays from 5-6pm in the Montana Room (359 NAH).
