








Is College a Good Value?





Change in per capita income in rural counties from 2008 to 2009


- Average income rose more than \$800

Unemployment Falls Further in March Daily Yonder | READ STORY

Unemployment in rural counties continued to run at a higher rate than in either exurban or urban counties in March 2011. But rates everywhere are dropping.

Rural Unemployment: March 2011

Most rural counties (those in purple) had March unemployment rates below the national average



National Average Unemployment: 9.2% in March

- Above national average by 3 points or more
- Above national average by fewer than 3 points
- Below national average by up to 2 points
 - Below national average by more than 2 points

Federal Program Overlooks Rural America





From 11.1% to 20% deficient


From 1% to 8% deficient
