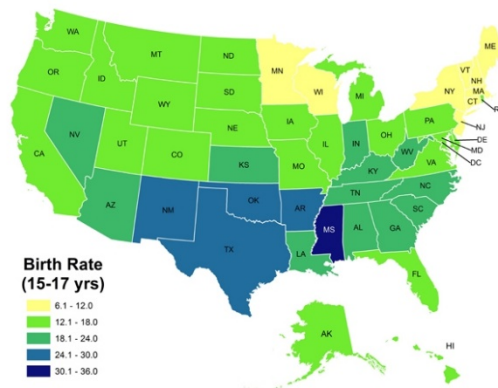

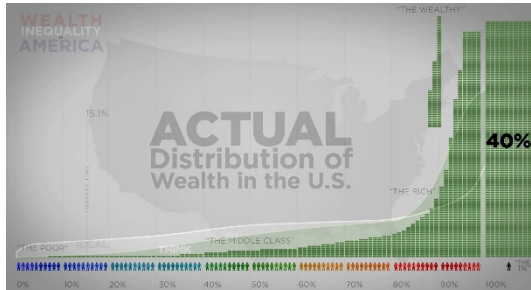

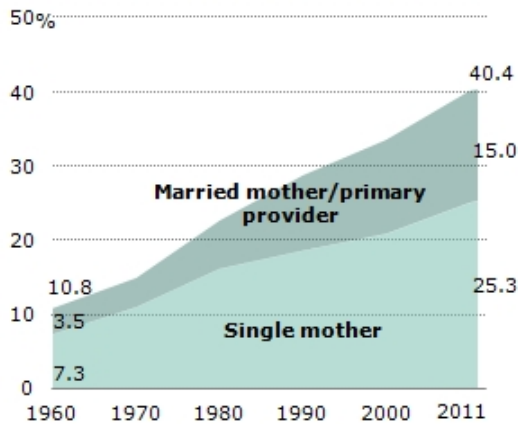
Mothers as Primary Providers

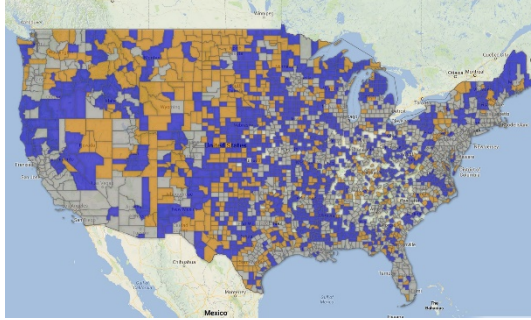

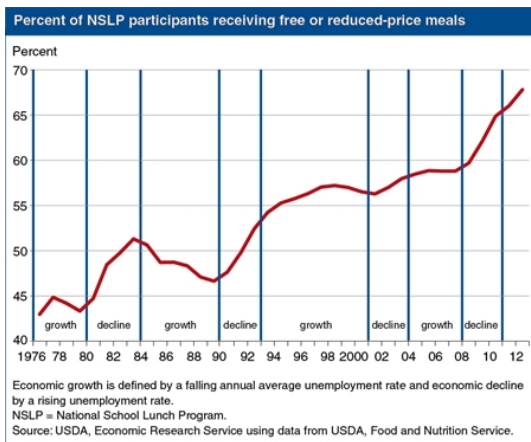

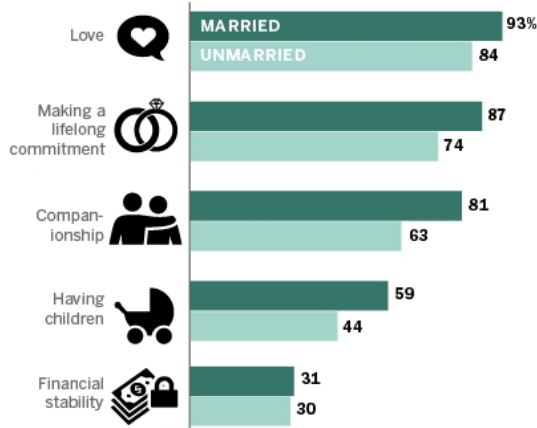
