







EnergyWire reports that the rate of spills and other accidents involving railroad transport of crude oil has spiked significantly in recent years, as corroborated by this report from Oregon Public Broadcasting. There were only one or two incidents a year in the early 1990's, whereas there were 88 separate incidents in 2012, a number of which were connected to the Bakken oil field.




