**Camp 1:** May 29<sup>th</sup> – June 9<sup>th</sup>

- Two Medicine Formation, Choteau, MT

**Camp 2:** June 12<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup>

- Judith River Formation, Ryegate, MT

**Camp 3:** June 26<sup>th</sup> – July 3<sup>rd</sup>

- Bearpaw Shale & Hell Creek formations, central and eastern MT

**Camp 4:** July 6<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup>

- Kootenai Formation, Lewistown, MT

**Camp 5:** July 24<sup>th</sup> – August 18<sup>th</sup>

- Hell Creek Formation, Glendive, MT



- **Minimum commitment time for new volunteers is 2 weeks.** Students may stay for a single or multiple camps, and up to the duration of the summer season (~11 weeks).
- Fieldwork occurs in the remote Montana backcountry and consists of strenuous physical activity conducted during hot summer months under changing and unpredictable weather conditions.
