### **Assistant Professor, Insect Biodiversity**

#### **University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign**

The Department of Entomology and the School of Integrative Biology at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign invite applications for a 9-month tenure-track assistant professor position in insect biodiversity.

The successful candidate will engage in research and teaching in insect biodiversity at levels including phylogenomics, biogeography, and conservation genomics; anthropogenic influences on biodiversity is a priority. Opportunities for campus collaborations are diverse and include scientists at the Illinois Natural History Survey with its insect collection of ~7 million specimens.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. in entomology, biology, genetics/genomics, conservation biology, or a related discipline. Candidates with a record of commitment to advancing groups historically marginalized or underrepresented in the field through teaching, mentoring, or administration are especially encouraged to apply. Interviews may take place before the closing date; however, no hiring decision will be made until after that date.
