Biologist position GS 9 Term

The U.S. Geological Survey, Northern Rocky Mountain Science Center (NOROCK) is initiating outreach for interest in a biologist position focused on wildlife diseases in the western U.S. The duty station for the position is in Bozeman, Montana working with Dr. Paul Cross. This position will assist with the implementation and administration of ongoing projects as well as develop their own project in consultation with the Project Lead. Applicants should have a Masters or equivalent experience related to disease and wildlife ecology preferably with field and quantitative skills. NOROCK recognizes that the effectiveness and creativity of a group is strengthened by contributions from a broad range of perspectives. As such, we particularly welcome candidates from groups that are historically underrepresented in our field and/or have demonstrated leadership toward building an equitable and inclusive environment.

Duties will require maintaining and curating datasets and field equipment as well as assisting with field sampling efforts and organizing logistical aspects of these projects. Working with local landowners and wildlife managers is an important component of this position. Camping, travel, preparation of lab samples, and fieldwork in all weather conditions will be required, but are likely to be intermittent.

Full-time Term position at the GS 9 payscale for 1-4 years depending on performance and funding.
