- | 1841: Everest's location first recorded
- | 1852: Everest named the highest mountain in the world
- | 1856: Everest's first official measurement (29,002 ft)
- | 1865: Everest is officially named
- | 1924: First Attempt by Mallory and Irvine (British)
- | 1953: First Summit by Hillary and Norgay
- | 1963: First American Summit by Whittaker
- | 1975: First Female Summit by Tabei (Japanese)
- | 1980: First Winter Summit by Zawada, Cichy, and Wielicki
- | 1999: Conrad Anker discovers the body of Mallory
- | 2000: Fastest ascent, Babu Chiri Sherpa, Base Camp to summit <17 hrs

- | 1880s: Official name first printed
- | 1889: First Attempt by USGS team
- | 1898: Second Attempt
- | 1923: First summit by Koch, Whitham, and Furguson
- | 1947: First Female Summit by Underhill
- | 1963: First Youngest Person Summit (10 year old)
- | 1966: First Winter Summit
- | 1995: First One Day Summit (Alex Lowe)
- | 2005: Fastest Summit by Sid Hayes, round trip, 5 hrs., 30 min.
