EVENT DESCRIPTION

The Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse Finals (WRHF) on Saturday, September 8, 2018 is open to all 4-H youth enrolled in the 4-H Working Ranch Horse project (Levels 1-4). 4-H youth wishing to compete in WRHF must be enrolled in the 4-H Working Ranch Horse project and be in good standing in 4-H. There is no requirement that youth compete at a county level or qualifying show to participate in WRHF. The 4-H youth is required to be enrolled in the same county level as the level entered in at WRHF. One horse must be used for all classes within the level. Horse must be an approved project horse for the current 4-H year.

The WRHF is formatted in accordance with the curriculum manual for the Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse project. Each competitor will exhibit in 5 classes on Saturday, September 8, 2018. The classes are:

- 1. Knowledge Test
- 2. Pattern
- 3. Sorting
- 4. Heading
- 5. Heeling

Each class is scored on a scale from 1 to 100 points. Awards will be given for winners in each class, level, and cumulative scores.

WRHF is name such as it is an opportunity to bring together all 4-H youth entered in the Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse project (Levels 1-4) to one location to offer a fun, educational, and competitive experience. The WRHF committee strives to have an event that is affordable for families and offers a variety of prizes. The WRHF committee wants to promote the growth of the Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse project and to be welcoming and inclusive to all those interested.

The Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse Finals (WRHF) on Sunday, September 9, 2018 is open to all youth. Youth do not need to be enrolled in 4-H but in the appropriate age groups to compete. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior age groups are based on the age of the child as of October 1, 2017. Colt classes are for horses 5 years old and younger. Age categories for youth are:

Juniors: 8 to 10 years old
Intermediate: 11-13 years old
Senior: 14-18 years old

The WRHF event on Sunday, September 9, 2018 is formatted in accordance with the Montana 4-H Working Ranch Horse project and styled after the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) Versatility Ranch Horse (VRH) and Stock Horse of Texas (SHOT) organizations. Rules are adapted from these organizations and AQHA/SHOT score sheets will be used. Classes include ranch pleasure/riding, ranch reining, working cow horse, and ranch trail. Exhibitors may enter any number of classes. Different horses may be ridden for separate classes. Exhibitors show by age or enter by age of horse in colt classes. For overall competition winners in each division, points will only be counted from one horse that demonstrates exceptional versatility in many areas.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

Grievance committee shall consist of three committee members of the Montana State 4-H Working Ranch Horse Finals. **A fee of \$25 will accompany any and all protest.**

AWARDS AND PRIZES

The WRHF committee has collected a wide variety of fabulous awards and prizes. The awards and prizes made possible by a great number of generous sponsors and donors. Make sure you send a thank you note to each award and prize you are awarded. A card with the sponsors' name and address will be on the award or prize.

PERSONAL SAFETY AND HELMET POLICY

Please remember to be safe around horses and wear the proper riding gear. Do not communicate with strangers and be aware of your settings. Please make sure you are accompanied by an adult. If you would like to report an incident, do so immediately to the show office located in the King's Arena. A certified equestrian helmet with safety harness fastened in place is required in over fence classes and gymkhana events, activities, and practice sessions. Gymkhana refers to horseback speed events (timed or un-timed) that do not use livestock. Events that usually fall in this category include, but are not limited to: barrel racing, pole bending, keyhole races, stake races, rescue races, pony express race, etc. Events that are not intended to be included in this policy are events such as calf roping, team roping, goat tying, and team penning that may be timed but use livestock. The Montana 4-H Center for Youth Development encourages the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Protective headgear may be used in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition. All horses must have a 14-day Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) and proof of a current (within 6 months) rhinopneumonitis vaccination to compete at the 2018 Montana 4-H State Working Ranch Horse Finals and State Horse Show. Other vaccinations recommended are tetanus, West Nile, influenza, and Eastern/Western Equine Encephalomyelitis. **ONE CVI PER HORSE.**

NOTE: Horses competing at the 2018 Montana 4-H State Working Ranch Horse Finals and State Horse Show may use the same CVI as long as the inspection and vaccination date windows comply. See below.**
