#### **Market Swine Tagging**

IMPORTANT: All market hogs must be tagged and identification forms turned into the office by May 1st. Tagging forms are attached to this email, available <u>online</u>, or can be submitted via <u>google form</u>. Contact the Extension Office or Hugh Braaten at 406.439.8873 if you have any questions.

#### **Project Add/Drop Deadline**

Don't forget to add or drop projects by May 1st! You can do this online through Zsuites or through the Extension Office. Project meeting and workshop information is only sent out to the members who are currently enrolled in a project. Make sure that your project list in Zsuites is accurate so that you don't miss out on any information!

#### **Multi-County 4-H Camp**

Registration is open for 4-H Camp on June 6-9 near Monarch. Registration will be done via ZSuites. 4-H members in grades 3-6 are eligible for camp. We have many fun, interactive activities planned to challenge you and help you learn as an individual. The registration fee for Broadwater County 4-H campers is \$60 and counselors are \$40, thanks to a contribution from the 4-H Council. Campers, counselors and chaperones must register online by May 12th as well as submit payment and medical forms to the office. We also still need a chaperone from our county to attend camp. IMPORTANT: All Market Lambs and Meat Goats must be in your possession by May 15th. There will be a Mandatory Sheep/Goat Weigh-In and Tagging on Tuesday, May 16th at 6:00 pm at Galor Genetics (8393 US HWY 287, Townsend). All market lambs and goats must attend the tagging. If you cannot attend, then you must make arrangements for someone else to bring your animal. No exceptions. Breeding animals are welcomed to get weighed but are not required to attend. Also please be prepared to share information about your animal including breed, breeder and date of birth. ### **Market Rabbit and Poultry**

If you plan to take market pens of poultry or rabbits to the Fair, they must be in your possession by June 25th and you are required to complete and turn in an identification form, due June 26th. Since there is no official tagging for these animals, we use a form. The form is included in this newsletter email and an online google form is available <u>here</u>. This form is not needed for pet rabbits or poultry, laying hens or breeding projects. It is only necessary if you plan to take a market project to Fair and sell it through the livestock auction.

#### **Market Livestock Activity Requirements**

To show and sell market livestock (including poultry and rabbits) at the Fair all 4-H members must complete seven (7) "activity points" for each market project by the Fair entry deadline. There was a najor change this year that sets a limit on the number of activities that senior members (ages 14-18) can complete from their project book. Senior members are now limited to a maximum of three activities from the book. So if you are a senior member, then you need to plan ahead to make sure you have enough points! The updated form is attached to this email.

Junior members (ages 8-13) can complete all seven activities from the project book or choose from a variety of other options. Both juniors and seniors can also do other activities such as attending a workshop, livestock judging, outside shows, helping a younger member or organizing a workshop. Details are on the form. The activities must be fully completed, dated and signed off by your helper. For each of these items, you should write a paragraph about what you learned in that educational experience. Please use the form to document your points. The form, books and documentation must be turned into the office by the fair entry deadline, July 6th. No other books are due at this time.

#### **Livestock Quality Assurance**

All 4-H members who plan to enter market livestock (beef, sheep, swine, goat, rabbit or poultry) and breeding projects in the Fair are REQUIRED to take livestock quality assurance (QA) every other year in order to participate. There will be two in-county training opportunities this year:

Advanced QA – Sunday, April 30 at 2:00 pm. This workshop will take place at Hidden Hollow Ranch's feedlot off of Flynn Lane.Directions have been emailed.This session is geared towards senior level members (ages 14-18).

General QA – Tuesday, June 20th at 6:30 pm at the 4-H Building at the Fairgrounds. This session is geared towards all members.

## **4-H ANIMAL PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

#### **4-H Market Livestock Insurance** NEW this year, the 4-H Livestock Committee will be providing insurance for all 4-H market

NEW this year, the 4-H Livestock Committee will be providing insurance for all 4-H market animals during Fair. This insurance covers all market animals including sale animals, feeders and buddy animals in transit to Fair and while animals are on the grounds for death or crippling. It also covers animals going to processors until slaughter but does not cover animals going home after they leave the grounds. It also does not cover any breeding, dairy or pet animals. The insurance covers market value of the animal which will be compensated to the exhibitor prior to the sale or for non-sale animals or to the buyer after the sale.

The cost of the insurance is still in negotiation but is estimated at \$25 per animal. This fee will be deducted from sale checks after Fair.If you would like to provide insurance for your animal prior to Fair, there are several insurance companies that will provide this coverage for you.

#### **Dairy Goat**

Members are required to complete a Horse Identification Form for every horse that you are using for a 4-H Horse project. It is attached to the newsletter email. The Horse ID form is due to the Extension Office on May 1st. Also included with the ID form is the vaccination form. It is due by the first riding practice or May 1st, whichever is first. Make it easy on yourself and turn both in at the same time! If you need to change horses after May 1st, then you need to submit a new ID form along with a statement (written or electronic) of why you are changing horses.
