4-H Project Award Checklist – UPDATED FORM

Did you know 4-H members can earn awards in their projects at the end of the 4-H year?! It's true! The system was created to reward members who go above and beyond in their 4-H projects, and recently went through an update. 4-H members have the opportunity to earn certificates or discs in each project area. Along with their disc, first year 4-H members receive a Broadwater County 4-H plague indicating successful completion of the 4-H year. To earn a certificate in a project, 4-H members must complete their 4-H record sheets for that project. To earn a disc, members must complete their record book along with several electives, depending on number of years in the project. A checklist with the electives is attached with the newsletter email. Start planning early to make sure you have enough electives. The 4-H story has also historically been a requirement for 4-H project awards but has been removed as a requirement. The 4-H story will remain as a piece of the record book, and annual awards will still be given for top stories. However, it is no longer required for project awards. Clear as mud?! Contact the Extension Office if you have ANY questions.

4-H Volunteer InstituteRegistration is now open for this event on February 17-19 in Billings. It is open to all adults 4-H volunteers. Registration is \$75, and the Broadwater County 4-H Council will cover your registration to attend (reimbursed after the event)! Lodging is on your own. Market Livestock Activity Requirements – UPDATED FORM

The Livestock Committee recently updated the market livestock activity requirements. The new form is attached with the newsletter email. To show and sell market livestock (including poultry and rabbits) at the Fair all 4-H members must complete seven (7) "activity points" for each market project by the Fair entry deadline.

One option is to complete 7 activities in your 4-H Project book. One major change to the requirements is that there is now a limit on the number of project book activities that a senior 4-H Animal Project Activities member (ages 14-18) can do. They are limited to three book activities. However, junior members (ages 8-13) can still do all seven activities from the book. There are still many other options! You may also choose other activities such as attending a workshop, livestock judging, outside shows, helping a younger member or organizing a workshop. For each of these items, you should write a paragraph about what you learned during the educational experience. These educational experiences can be in-person or virtual but must pertain directly to your 4-H project.

The form, books and documentation must be turned into the office by the fair entry deadline.

What are County Contests?

Here are the descriptions of each of the contests being held at the County Contest Extravaganza! Read through them and decide which contest you want to enter!

Communications—This contest recognizes the importance of developing high level communication skills as an essential life skill. Here you have an opportunity to practice and demonstrate communication skills through a variety of different methods. The following are components of the contest: illustrated talk, commercial, impromptu speech, demonstration, video, career communications and prepared speech. You may participate in one or multiple components of the contest. Each component of the contest has a unique set of rules, so be sure to review them before participating.

Fashion Revue— This contest emphasizes skill development in selecting, constructing, accessorizing and modeling garment(s). You also develop skills in communication, self-confidence, poise and decision making. There are two categories of the contest. The traditional category is where you bring a new garment that you made. Items can be sewn, hand-knitted or crocheted. The refashioned category is where you take an existing clothing item and repurpose it into a significantly wearable garment or look. Participants interview with a judge in addition to modeling the item.

Hooked on Cooking – This is an opportunity for members to demonstrate cooking skills. It is open to junior members (8-13 years old) as individuals or teams. The contest emphasizes having fun while cooking and developing skills for safe, nutritious and proper presentation of food. Each year is a new theme and participants create a meal and place setting and interview with a judge.

Stir-Ups— This is an opportunity for participants to showcase cooking skills and nutritional knowledge. It is open to any members who are 13 years old or older as individuals or teams. Participants will prepare an appealing, nutritious meal and participate in an interview with the judge. Each year there is a new and a list of possible ingredients. Participants must use specific ingredients from the provided list to come up with your own creation.
