Trail Stewardship Program (TSP) Overview

- TSP was created with the passing of Senate Bill 24 in 2019
- A state funded grant program that supports motorized and non-motorized trail improvement projects
- Since 2021, TSP has awarded approximately \$3.6 million to 104 project across Montana





Project Eligibility

Eligible Organizations:

- Local governments
- Tribal governments
- School districts
- Recreational clubs/organizations
- 501(c)(3) non-profits

Eligible Projects:

- Rehabilitation and maintenance projects
- New trail and path construction
- Trailside and trailhead facilities construction





Award & Match Requirements

Award Amount

- Maximum: \$75,000.00
- Up to 7% for administrative costs

Match Requirement

- 10% of total project cost
 - In-kind labor/materials
 - Cash
