

for success in a project unless there is a leader to see that the work is carried on. It is therefore, evident that very little project work can be done in un-organized communities.

It is our aim to have some demonstrations located so as to give a point of contact with the un-organized communities in the county. Demonstrations which are of county wide interest and which are such a nature that they necessarily require direct supervision from the extension office are best adapted to this purpose. Boy's and Girl's Club work seems to be the project which adapts itself most readily to unorganized communities. We endeavor to have Boy's and Girl's club organizations in every community where we can find a local club leader. In no cases, however, is a club organized without a local leader. It has been found that unless someone living in the community can give personal attention to the club it is seldom that the club project is carried to completion. Where ever we can find suitable local leadership we are very keen to have such work established, not only because of the fact that it gives splendid training to the club members, but also because it is usually the means of getting a community started in organized Extension work along other lines.

(3) General policies, including relationships to other organizations.

The Extension Organization in the county is glad to cooperate with all other organizations and agencies in order to accomplish the aims of the Extension Service program.

Splendid cooperation and assistance has been given during the past year by a number of individuals and organizations. The following are outstanding examples:

Every bank in the County cooperated to finance the Boy's and Girl's Pig Club.

Six banks gave forty five dollars in cash for pig club premiums.

The Baker Commercial Club financed the Inter-Community Fair, the County Corn Show, the Poultry show and the Boy's and Girl's Pure Bred Pig Sale

The Ollie Commercial Club Financed the Ollie Community Fair.

The National Jersey Record Association gave twenty five dollars in cash and a silver trophy for pig club premiums.

All of the auctioneers in the county donated their services for the Boys' and Girls' Purebred Pig Sale.
