2023

4-H Enrollment Deadline

Please remind current members, cloverbuds and leaders that they need to complete re-enrollment in ZSuites, pay dues and return the completed Yearly 4-H Enrollment Agreement to the Extension Office by January 1st. Reminder, the 4-H agreement form is NOT one of the agreements signed on ZSuites, it is its own sheet that needs to be printed and signed and turned into the Extension office.

Leaders please also make sure new families are aware of the deadline and know they can contact the Extension Office for help and information if needed.

4-H Enrollment Tips

- 1) Pick up a Clover- Project Selection Guide from your Club Leader or the Extension Office
- a. Carefully read all of the enclosures and the sections about the projects you are taking.
- 2) Go online to ZSuites (instructions are on and insert in the Clover)
- a. New Families- Create a family account and then add cloverbuds, members and leaders.
- b. Re-enrolling- go to your Family Account and re-enroll you may also add new cloverbuds, members and leaders.
- c. Projects- Cloverbuds are 5 to 7-year-old and will only take the Cloverbud Project. Ist year members should start with one or two projects.
- 3) Pay dues- you may pay online for a \$1 fee, or hit pay in person and come into the Extension Office
- 4) Yearly agreement- ask your club leader for this form and review it with your leader and parents. Sign and return to your leader, or the Extension Office.

4-H Literature Packets After your enrollment is complete

After your enrollment is complete you will receive your 4-H Literature packet at your club meeting. There will be two copies of your enrollment sheet on the top of the packet- please proofread:

- * The spelling and capitalization of your name. Please, no all caps.
- * Your mailing address, phone, and email address
- Your date of birth, grade, and gender (Your 4-H age will be your age on Oct. 1, 2023)
- Year in 4-H
 - ~Year in 4-H should be I for first year cloverbuds
- ~Your year in 4-H should be 1 for first year members (cloverbud years do not count)
 - ~Year in 4-H should be I for first year leaders.
- ~Members years go up one year for each year you complete your record book.
- * Check your projects, make sure they are all listed and correct
- ~Project years would go up one, if you completed the records and required workbook activities.
 - 'You will move up a level when your workbook is complete.

Each member may tag up-to three animals in each class (max 3 steers and 3 heifers).. Each member may tag up-to three animals in each class (max 3 steers and 3 heifers).

Fergus and Petroleum County members must have their weigh-and-tag paperwork turned in to the Extension office by January 15th if they plan to show/sell in the 2024 fair. Animals will not be considered entered and eligible for fair if BOTH weigh sheets and a CLEAR picture of the ear tag are not both submitted by January 15th.

Livestock Policy Changes

- 1. Back Tags will now match animal ear tag numbers and will be required as exhibitors enter the ring.
- 2. Weight Changes:

Beef: 1150-1500 lbs

Goat: 60-120 lbs

- 3. Two of each class, including breeding. This allows exhibitors brining breeding animals to show 2 animals in each class.
- 4. Cross Entries heifers will now be able to be cross entered into multiple classes.
- 5. Out-of-County Entries: Out-of-county exhibitors will be held to the same standards and deadlines as in county exhibitors and paperwork will be due to the Fergus-Petroleum County Extension Office.
- 6. Feeder Classes were voted out and there will not be a "market" class for them. Exhibitors will still have the opportunity to show in showmanship classes.
