Doney Scholarship

Purpose:

The Frank and Vera Doney Scholarship was established in December 2005.

This scholarship is made possible through a generous donation by Ellis and Bette Doney, Robert and Kathy Doney, and Arleene Doney Weppler in memory of Frank and Vera Doney. Funds will be awarded after the applicant provides proof of enrollment in higher education.

Scholarship Award:

At least one (1) scholarship in the amount of \$1000

Scholarship Criteria:

- 1- Active 4-H Enrollment during current 4-H year
- 2- Plan to study and agriculturally related major in higher education (including quine science and vet medicine.)
- 3- Must turn in 4-H record book with application
- 4- Must complete Gallatin 4-H Foundation Scholarship application paperwork

Evaluation Criteria:

Scholarship applications will be scored and reviewed by a committee appointed by the Gallatin County 4-H Foundation.

Announcement and Distribution of Funds:

Funds will be mailed to the school directly once the applicant provides proof of registration. Recipient will be notified by mail and/or email.

Market Livestock Scholarship

Purpose:

The Gallatin Market Livestock Scholarship was established in 2020.

This scholarship is made possible through donations and commission from the Gallatin 4-H Market Livestock Sale. Funds will be awarded after the applicant provides proof of enrollment in higher education.

Scholarship Award:

At least one (1) scholarship in the amount of \$1000 based on the merit of the application.

Scholarship Criteria:

- 1- Active 4-H Enrollment status all through high school (4 years)
- 2- 4-H club member all through high school (4 years)
- 3- Must turn in 4-H record book with application
- 4- Actively participated/sold in a 4-H market livestock project during 4 years of high school
- 5- Must complete Gallatin 4-H Foundation Scholarship application paperwork

Evaluation Criteria:

Scholarship applications will be scored and reviewed by a committee appointed by the Gallatin County 4-H Foundation.

Announcement and Distribution of Funds:

Funds will be mailed to the school directly once the applicant provides proof of registration. Recipient will be notified by mail and/or email.

Gallatin County 4-H Foundation Scholarship

Purpose:

This scholarship was established in 2016 by the Gallatin County 4-H Foundation Board of Directors to honor and support graduating seniors who have been active in 4-H during high school. The scholarship is open to all Gallatin County 4-H youth graduating high school and attending higher education in any field.

At least one (1) scholarship in the amount of \$1000

- 1- Active 4-H Enrollment during current 4-H year (4 years)
- 2- 4-H club member through high school (4 years)
- 3- Must turn in 4-H record book with application
- 4- Must complete Gallatin 4-H Foundation Scholarship application paperwork

Evaluation Criteria:

Scholarship applications will be scored and reviewed by a committee appointed by the Gallatin County 4-H Foundation.

Announcement and Distribution of Funds:

The successful applicant will receive funds for their 2nd semester of higher education. Funds will be mailed to the school directly once applicant provides registration of 2nd semester. Recipient will be notified by mail and/or email.

On a separate sheet of paper, write at least one paragraph covering each of the sections below.

Section 1: Leadership

Write a narrative of your Leadership Life Skills. It is important to relate these skills to the 4-H leadership roles you have held during the past four years, such as holding an office, serving on a committee, and/or 4-H project work. Discuss what you learned from your leadership experiences.

Section 2: Citizenship

Write a narrative of your citizenship experiences (include 4-H experiences). Citizenship is an important part of the 4-H program. It can be described as who or what we are, as what we believe, or as what we do. Identify ways you have participated in citizenship experiences and describe what you learned about your community, school, or country, and about yourself in the process.

Section 3: Community Service

Write a narrative of your community service experiences (include 4-H experiences).

Community service is what you do as an individual or group to help your community. Identify community service projects and activities in which you have participated and describe what you learned through the experience.

Section 4: 4-H Story

Share information about you as a person. Emphasize your personal growth and development. This is your opportunity to share how 4-H has contributed to who you are! You could include your most significant 4-H projects, activities, and experiences. If you identify projects and activities, discuss the skills you learned and how these experiences are important to you now and in the future. Share what you learned from these experiences and how they will assist you in the future.

Section 5: Career Goals

What is your major field of study? What are your reasons for choosing this course of study? How will your post-secondary education assist you in attaining your career goals?
