There are several levels for the awards which are on the following pages. Each level has a brief description of what a 4-H member must do to earn the award. You may nominate yourself for the award and then have your 4-H leader sign off on the nomination form.

- 1. Read the directions carefully, each Achievement Level has different requirements.
- 2. Fill out the Glacier 4-H Member Recognition Form (page 2). Circle the achievement level that you want to be considered for.
- 3. Fill out the Achievement Level form that shows what you have done to earn recognition.

- 4. On pages 3 5 is a list of optional activities that may be used on the different award forms. All optional activities must be related to the 4-H program. - 5. Make sure your 4-H leaders has reviewed and signed off on the nomination form.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR 4-H ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS All activities must be related to 4-H, unless noted below.



Each of the Optional Activities listed may be used only one time per award.

INDIVIDUAL

- 1) Develop and submit with this application, a career plan pertaining to a current 4-H project.
- 2) Develop a Self-Determined project of your own choosing. Describe project, goals and accomplishments.
- 3) Use your 4-H background to develop other leadership roles in the community. Examples include: leading a station at basketball camp, junior hunter education, obtaining a lifeguard certificate, going on a mission trip where 4-H skills were used.
- 4) Become a 4-H Ambassador in Glacier County 4-H and assist with recruiting new members.
- 5) Present (teach) a county-wide or regional project workshop for youth enrolled in that project.
- 6) Facilitate (plan, advertise, contact speaker, etc.) a county-wide 4-H project workshop. Member must be in attendance.
- 7) Be an assistant leader or leader for Cloverbuds in your 4-H club or county. Write a detailed explanation of your part in planning and helping with the Cloverbuds. Tell how you helped and what you did.
- 8) Serve on a county-wide, 4-H County, or Marias Fair committee or the 4-H Council during the year (i.e. Horse Committee, etc.)
- 9) Take the State 4-H Shooting Sports Training and become a certified Junior Leader in one of the shooting sports disciplines.
- 10) Promote 4-H or project work through the journalism media, i.e. article in local newspaper, beef or other journals, specific magazines related to your project area, flyers or pamphlets etc. You must write the news article. (4-H Club Reporter articles are not eligible for this award). Include your article with your application for member recognition.
- 11) Assist your family to serve as a host to an IFYE delegate. Name and country of IFYE student and year your family served as a host (or year that you traveled to another country).
- 12) Assist your family to serve as a host for an international student or participate in an international exchange. Name and country of exchange student and year your family served as a host (or year that you traveled to another country).
- 13) Participate in 4-H work in your community, county, or at a state-wide event. Tell what was done or attach a statement made by another person on your behalf (required).
- 14) Participate in a club or 4-H Council Fundraiser.
- 15) Participate in a non-4-H, academic event. Example: Science Fair, FCCLA, etc.

CLUB

- 16) Serve as an officer in your 4-H club. List the office you held.
- 17) Assist in organizing a new 4-H club. Write a detailed explanation of your part in planning for and helping with the organization of the new club. Tell how you helped and what you did.
- 18) Share knowledge and/or experiences with another 4-H club.
- 19) Serve as acting, assistant or additional project leader to promote a specific project or event in a club. Tell what you did and how you served.
- 20) Participate in a 4-H Club service project.

COUNTY 4-H

- 21) Present a communications presentation in your county or Marias Fair 4-H speech or demonstration day. List title, give dates and share what your award was.
- 22) Receive a top award in at Glacier County Communications Contest, list award and date.
- 23) Make one or more public presentations of 4-H work to school, church or civic group. (A presentation means giving a talk, being on a panel, being a member of a play or skit, giving a demonstration before a non-4-H group, or speaking on radio or television). Explain type and nature of presentation.
- 24) Special work with service or humanitarian groups in the name of 4-H. A written description of what you did, with details is required.
- 25) Promotion of 4-H through group activity, that promotes 4-H work through civic or school groups, talks, window displays, exhibits, parades, correlation with church, promotion of National 4-H Week.
- 26) Share the responsibility of planning and conducting county-wide 4-H events, workshops, contest, judging events, clinic, achievement banquets, Communications Contest, Project Daays or others. A written description of what you did, with details is required.
- 27) Participate <u>individually</u> in a county-wide fundraiser (ex. for Council, Shooting Sports, Cloverbuds, etc.)

DISTRICT / REGIONAL

- 29) Participate in the multi-county 4-H camp as a camper or junior counselor.
- 30) Compete as a <u>4-H member</u> in district, regional or state event during the current 4-H year. Example: A judging contest, shooting sports competition, demonstration, fashion revue, Student Ag Expo, NILE, KMON Judging, MT Range Days, jackpot animal shows, Winter Fair, etc. List type of event, type of participation and date of participation.
- 31) Participate in a regional recreation lab.
- 32) Be an <u>active</u> participant in a 4-H District Leadership Forum. Contribute to the conference through your work and involvement. A written description of what you did with details is required.
- 33) Attend leadership building event event.
- 34) Serve on National or Regional committee. Give name of committee, your role, and dates of service.

STATE 4-H

- 36) Ambassador prospect. Give year and describe participation.
- 37) Serve as a 4-H Ambassador. Give year and type of participation
- 38) Delegate to Montana 4-H Pre-Congress. List dates, workshops attended and the planning activities where you participated.
- 39) Delegate to Montana 4-H Congress. List date and type of participation.
- 40) Participate in the Montana 4-H Leadership Forum. Give location, dates and type of involvement.
