This is a great fundraiser for the 4-H Council, and over \$900 was raised which will go towards member awards, thank you gifts for presenters, educational materials, member travel scholarships, etc.

Up to \$500 is available to a group for a project within the community, last year Clever Clovers received \$500 to plant flowers and make patio seat cushions for the Senior Center. A few ideas that could support the Marias Fair would be materials for curtains in the Rabbit/Poultry barn to cover up the tack, etc. that goes below the shelves, purchasing 10 foot panels for the hog show ring (easier to maneuver than the current 16 foot panels), etc. I would be happy to help a teen member write and submit a grant, or Camille Bradley would be a great resource as well.

Lastly, all of our Marias Fair committees have had their first meeting and many will be electing officers in January. Parents, leaders, and members are welcome to attend any of the committee meetings, watch the calendar for January meeting dates. The Ag Committee, which oversees the rabbit, poultry, cat, dog, and pocket pet shows along with the Horse Committee would especially like to have some additional members. 3 Tips for Record Book Success

- Assemble your records in a 3 ring binder or in your record book, making sure to have a 'My 4-H Year form', a non-animal project journal for each non-animal project (example Archery, Photography, Shotgun, Cooking, etc.) and an animal project journal for each animal project (example Swine, Horse, Cat, Dog, etc.) Make sure check that you have project books for each project.
- Each project journal should be labeled with the current 4-H year, project name, and at least 3 goals written/project. Goals should be SMART -Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time Based.
- Choose at least one time per month to work on record books. This may be on school holiday days, one evening per week (with no TV/social media from 7 - 8 p.m.), on days when parents sit down to pay bills, etc. With just 20 minutes a month, it's easy to stay organized for the 4-H year!



Steer Weigh-In Saturday, December 7 - Rod Hibbs - 9 to 11 a.m. (93 Pendergrass Rd)

Members need to attend one weigh-in. If you have an emergency that day, please let Kari know at 406-209-2953.

Important reminders from the rules in the fair book:

- Minimum weight for 2020 Marias Fair is 1,100 pounds, max payweight is 1,500 pounds, select steers accordingly.
- Each exhibitor may weigh in one spare animal/ species. If doing a pen of three, four market animals may be weighed in.
- Any breeding animals must have the 4-H Clover tattoo OR Association registration tattoo by the official hog weigh-in deadline (which will be in April, 2020). So, if you are doing a breeding project, your animal does not need to be weighed in at steer weigh-in, but must have an appropriate tattoo by April.
- All steers must be dehorned prior to weigh-in, as horned steers are NOT allowed at fair. Also, make sure your steer has been fully castrated and is not a stag.
- All steers must have been born after January 1, 2019.
- 4-Her must be 10 as of Oct. 1 to show a market beef animal.

Information you need to bring to weigh-in:

- Steer's birth date
- Breed of steer (including percentages of each breed)
- Breeder's name and address
