Fair Packets

Thank you, Northwest Farm Credit Services!

Last fall for her Junior Leadership project, Katelyn Suta pitched the idea to the Marias Fair 4-H Livestock Committee of adding swine 'on deck' pens to the show and sale ring at the fair. The 'on deck' pens will allow exhibitors and pigs to safely wait for their turn in the ring and have a place for the judge to send swine during the show as he places them. In addition, Katelyn proposed purchasing swine/lamb/goat panels for the showring that would eliminate the need to wire hog panels to the inside of cattle panels for the hog show and would reduce the number of times the ring had to be set up and torn down.

Katelyn secured quotes for the project, and the Livestock Committee agreed to purchase the swine on deck pens but challenged her to fundraise for the panels for the redesigned show ring. She applied for and received a Montana 4-H Foundation, Inc. \$500 People Partner grant and a \$5,000 Northwest Farm Credit Services grant as well! Thank you to Colleen Gustafson for the letter of support for the NWFCS grant.

Additionally, she has met with multiple groups and individuals about the project and has received \$4,880 from local 4-H supporters, 4-H clubs and councils! As long as prices remain stable, the funds for the panels have been raised but Katelyn would like to use any additional donations to to acknowledge project donors with a thank you.

Thank you to all of who have supported Katelyn's Junior Leadership Project, and a big thank you to Northwest Farm Credit Services, the Montana 4-H Foundation, Inc. and local donors as well! As long as there are no more price increases, the project has been fully funded!



Review the Rules

A reminder to read the fair book (at

http://mariasfair.msuextension.org/mariasfairbook/documents/2022%20Fair%20Book%20with%20Tabl e.pdf) to know what rules pertain to your exhibits, etc. Dress code is covered, if recipes need to be included, self-waterers are required in pig pens, cattle must have a neck rope, etc.

Maximum Sale Participation Weights

Market animals (any species) that are over the maximum sale participation weight (1,680 for steers, 185 for lambs, 336 for swine, 123 for goats) will show ONLY for showmanship and will NOT sell.



Swine members

The show ring and layout for the Marias Fair swine show will be different this year than in year's past. Members will be expected to have full control of their hogs from the swine barn into the show ring. The ring will be much larger so members should be very

comfortable driving their hogs around a large ring. There are numerous training resources and video available at http://montana4h.org/projects/animal_science/swine.html (and on

YouTube, etc.). Please reach out to a livestock leader or senior swine member for help and tips on training your hog if needed.
