### **Dogs in Distress!**

The Pondera County Sheriff's Office recently rescued 12 Pitbull type dogs from an abusive situation. Currently, the dogs are living in the pound in Conrad until the case can work it's way through the system. During this time, Pondera County is responsible for feeding and caring for the dogs. If anyone can help with this situation, the sheriff's office could use sturdy harnesses and leashes for walking the dogs. If you would like to donate money to help feed the dogs, there is a fund set up through the Pondera County Sheriffs Office. They would also welcome volunteers to spend a couple hours a week helping to care for the dogs in the pound. Although the dogs came from a bad situation, it sounds like they are quite friendly animals so any volunteers shouldn't have to be worried about working with aggressive animals. Supplies can be dropped off at 20 4th Ave SW, Conrad, or you can call 406-271-4060 for more information or to volunteer to walk dogs, etc.

### **Livestock Scale**

Members are encouraged to weigh their market livestock at least monthly from now until fair. For weighing small livestock, we do have the small scale available for lambs and pigs that the Glacier County 4-H Council purchased for our members. There is to be NO washing or clipping on the scale. The scale has electronic parts and if they get wet, that can cause them to become faulty. Please be sure to always lift up when carrying the scale (no dragging). If you need something to wash/clip in for pigs, there is a heavy duty frame for that at Sahm Winkowitsch's that can be borrowed and used, or many folks have modified the plastic chemical shuttles as well. Please return the scale within 72 hours of using it.

### Food Safety and Livestock Quality Assurance training

To participate in the fair, livestock members must complete livestock quality assurance training every other year and any members planning to exhibit must complete food safety training every other year as well. The following members need these trainings for the 2022 fair.

• A paper copy of the fair calendar will be included in the first fair packet. Paper copies of the fair book will not be included in the fair packets, but can be requested from the office.

• FOOD BOOTH: Members are required to work their assigned food booth shift. If extenuating circumstances come up and the member cannot work their shift, they must make arrangements with the food booth day chair or Wendy Wedum, to reschedule another shift. Members who do not work their food booth shift will not receive their premium check or be allowed to exhibit at the fair the following year.

• **ENTERTAINMENT**: The inflatable bounce houses and carnival will be back, and there will be Indian Relay Races Thursday and Friday nights, rodeo Saturday night and Sunday afternoon. 4-H Family entertainment passes will be \$150/family (immediate family only).

• MARIAS FAIR SILENT AUCTION: Glacier County 4-H Clubs are asked to donate an item to the silent auction in the Exhibit Building. The proceeds this year will go to the sidewalk project (spearheaded by Pondera 4-Her, Breauna Erickson). You can bring your items on Clean up Day or Wednesday of the fair.
