Please note, 4-H Family entertainment passes will be \$150/family this year (immediate family only) but will include Indian Relay Races Thursday and Friday and rodeo Saturday night and Sunday afternoon. Fair expenses can quickly add up so we recommend budgeting now for these summer expenses. If you receive a tax refund, earmarking part of that for summer activities, whether 4-H camp, fair passes, school supplies, or otherwise, can be a great idea.

Registration opens in Zsuites February 1st and is just \$75! Late registration (March 1 - 7) is \$125. Members and volunteers will login to their Zsuites profile and click on the event in the calendar or under events and complete the registration. Participants pay the county office and then they county sends Fergus 4-H Council one check for their county registration. Participants will select their workshops during registration. Both the Glacier County 4-H Council Event scholarship and Bret Wanken Memorial Fund scholarships are available to assist with registration cost, forms are available at https://glacier.msuextension.org/4H.html.

Swine Weighing/Tagging

It's 4-H pig tagging time! Saturday, April 16 is the deadline to tag a pig in for the Marias Fair. Please coordinate with Kari Lewis a time to weigh/tag/deworm your pigs. It is much preferred to tag them while in the trailer versus after they've been let out into a pen. Members need to have the following information:

- Breed of pig
- Date of birth
- Beginning weight
- Breeder's name and address

Remember, fair weigh-in date is Wednesday, July 20. Fair minimum weight is 220 pounds, maximum payweight is 300 pounds, maximum sale participation weight is 336 pounds. As a generalization, many of the show pig types tend to gain around 1.5 - 2.0 lbs/day while a commercial type pig can be 2.0 - 2.5 lbs/day. Calculate the days until fair from when you purchase your pig to determine what an appropriate beginning start weight would be.

For example, if we purchase our pigs April 1, that's 110 days until fair. If we start with 85 pound pigs...

- Pig Zippy gains 1.75 pounds/day, he gains 193 pounds and weighs 278 at fair.
- Pig Zelda gains 2.3 pounds/day, she gains 253 pounds and weighs 338 at fair (doesn't sell).

In this example with Zelda, we would probably want to get a lighter weight pig to start with, and/or purchase our pig closer to the April 16 deadline.

Marias Fair Swine Weights:
Minimum - 220 pounds
Maximum Payweight - 300 pounds
Maximum Sale Participation Weight - 336 pounds



Breeding Projects

Members with breeding projects must submit to Kari Lewis (kari.lewis@montana.edu) by April 16 any of the following forms of identification on any breeding animals they plan to exhibit at fair:

- Bangs tag number
- Scrapie tag number
- Association registration tattoo
- Picture of animal

4-H'ers needs to have full possession of their project animal at this time.

Glacier County 4-H Council Senior Scholarship

Graduating seniors are eligible to apply for the Glacier County 4-H Council scholarship, which has been made possible through generous donations and memorials to the Council. The scholarship seeks to recognize Glacier County 4-H members who have been active in their club and community and set an example of, "Making the Best Better." Depending on the number and quality of applicants, members receive up to \$500, but no less than \$250. Applications are due by 5 p.m. April 25 to the Glacier County Extension Office and will be e-mailed out with the March newsletter.
