Greetings!

It's time to kick off a new 4-H year already! This year we'll be using ZSuites versus 4-HOnline, and I think you'll like it! Anytime there's change it takes a bit getting used to, but ZSuites has a ton of great features including a dashboard for announcements, the ability to share files (we'll have our newsletters up there), a calendar of 4-H events, event registration capability, etc. In addition, members can do their record books through ZSuites and then leaders and myself have the ability to check books and leave comments and mark if books are complete, need revision, etc. There is a chat feature through ZSuites with awesome customer service, so don't hesitate to use that as well.

Families are welcome to begin enrolling October 1 through ZSuites at www.4h.zsuite.org. There is the capability to accept online payments, however the ability add on project book fees is not yet a part of the program. However, we are going to try to do that on our end. We'll review your enrollment and then e-mail you when you can pay (either online or with cash/check).

As you sign up for the new 4-H year, I would encourage members to sign up for at least one new project. 4-H offers an incredible opportunity to learn about new topics and I hope members use it to broaden their horizons. A rancher needs to know range science, vet science, and weed identification in addition to how to feed a cow. College dorm living may not be all its cracked up to be, and kids need to learn how to cook as well. Leathercraft, quilting, woodworking, or canning just may become a lifelong hobby as well. Check out the Clover magazine (available at our office) for project descriptions and also a listing of what materials are needed and their costs.

On the shooting sports front, we're still pursuing options for a building to use for archery and air rifle practice. Once we have a location confirmed, we'll set fees and practice schedules. I do not anticipate fees being any greater than they have been in the past (\$15/discipline/member and \$15/member range fee).

We do have some good news in that Mandi is back to 30 hours/week, and hopefully will be full-time down the road as well. Our office is now open 9 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, with staff available through the noon hour. Our supply and travel budget remains very tight, but we're glad to at least have Mandi back with more hours. I am continuing to maintain afternoon office hours (1 - 5 p.m.) but am available in the mornings via e-mail or feel free to call/text as well.

<u>4-H Club Officer Elections</u>

Club officers are elected annually, with the number of officers determined by club. Officers should regularly attend meetings and take a leadership role for their club. Here are some basic responsibilities for club officers:

President - Prepares the agenda with other officers and leader input, and presides at club meetings.

Vice President - Assumes President's duties in their absence, and has responsibility to oversee committees within the club.

Secretary - Keeps complete and accurate records/minutes of each club meetings, and writes all club correspondence (such as thank you notes, etc.) Keeps club attendance records, and submit meeting minutes to the Extension Office monthly.

Treasurer—Handles all club money, keeps accurate and up-to- date financial records, and advises club monthly of their current balance.

Historian - Maintains and updates the club's history book to preserve information for future club members.

Reporter - Writes news stories and/or takes pictures of club events for the 4-H newsletter and/or local newspaper.

4-H Club Financial Review

4-H club accounts are due in the Extension Office on or before October 31. Please remember to include the following:

- Check registers
- Invoices
- Receipts
- · Summaries of any fundraising activities

• Bank statements from Oct. 1, 2019 to Sept. 30, 2020.

This will review the account from the past year, and provide a fresh starting place for the coming treasurer.

Club Ideas

October is a great time to plan your coming 4-H year and decide what activities you would like to focus on.

Community Service - Choose at least one project to do as a club, ask the office for ideas if needed. You may want to 'adopt' a senior citizen for the year, share your projects, etc.

Field Trips - Visit the local vet clinic, a Hutterite colony barn, hospital, fire department, Customs/Border Patrol, etc.

Guest speakers - Invite guests to share about their career or a specific topic. EMS, Fire Department, Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, a legislative official, Customs and Border Patrol, etc. are all great options.

Demonstrations - Each member should do a demonstration or speech, plan if all demonstrations will be given on one day or if they will be given throughout the year.

Recreation - Plan some time for fun such as carving or painting pumpkins, pizza and bowling, sledding and hot chocolate, a game night, etc.

Reminder - Check your project level

As you re-enroll, be sure to check that you are enrolled in the appropriate level (example: Swine, Level 1 vs. Level 2 vs. Level 3.) Each level should take a maximum of three years.

Remember, you need to be able to complete 7 activities in the project book each year, so if there are less than 7 activities left in the project book, the member should move up to the next level. If you are unsure, please ask a leader or the Extension Office for help.

Project Age Requirements

You must meet the minimum required age by October 1, 2020.

- Cloverbuds 5 years old
- Regular 4-H 8 years old
- Shooting Sports 9 years old
- Market Beef & Beef Breeding 10 years old
- Teen Leadership 13 years old
- Ambassador 14 years old

• Colt to Maturity - 11 years old and have completed Horsemanship Levels 1, 2, and 3

2020-21 4-H Enrollment

NEW in 2020! Montana 4-H is switching to Zsuite for enrollment. Zsuite also provides a record book platform where members can work on books via a mobile device, leaders can check books remotely, etc.

A re-enrolling family should follow the following steps to access their record and set up their Zsuite account on or after October 1. This can be done on a computer or mobile device.

- Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/
- Click on Sign Up
- Fill in all of the fields to set up FAMILY account.
- Adult email should match the Family email loaded from 4Honline.
- Adult email and password will also be used for anyone in the family to login to ZSuite in the future.
- The Adult/Family email can be changed by the parent once the account is set up the first time.
- The pin is used by parents and is needed for enrollment of family members.
- · Click "Let's Go!"

• Each family member previously enrolled in 4Honline should appear on the main screen in a colored box.

- there is also an option to add a new family member.
- Click on each family member to go to their dash-board and begin enrollment.

• If at any point a family has trouble they can click the "CHAT" box at the bottom of their screen and chat with a ZSuite support person.



2020-21 4-H Fees

Once you enroll through ZSuites, our office will add project book fees to your enrollment and then follow up regarding payment options (online payment through ZSuites or cash/check). The online payment is a new feature that we'll be working with so please be patient as we see what works. The state 4-H office and ZSuites are working on this feature in the coming weeks.

Steer Selection

Getting ready to pick out your future champion? Here's what to look for when selecting a steer:

Muscle - look from behind for how wide a steer stands, and

look for width over the topline and through the hindquarter **Volume** - look for depth and curvature of rib (space to put the feed so they can grow) and length of body

Balance - the front end of the steer should fit well with the back end, with a straight topline

Structural correctness - look for a steer who stands square (and wide) on all four legs, who when he walks his back feet fill the track of where his front feet just left

Style - a 'clean fronted,' attractive steer that naturally holds his head up will help catch the judge's eye

Disposition - A steer that is nervous, has a wild mother, or seems wild is not a good 4-H steer candidate.

Teen Leadership & Ambassador Training

We have had interest from members to serve as county ambassadors. The purpose of the ambassador program is to represent 4-H in a public relations role, promote 4-H with potential members, parents and the general public, help plan, implement and evaluate 4-H events. organize 4-H promotion activities, develop personal leadership skills and self-confidence, and encourage financial support for 4-H. An application form will be e-mailed out to members 14 and over. County ambassadors can apply to be state ambassadors as well and participate in Congress pre-planning, etc. Ambassadors must be 14 years of age by October 1 of current year. They must have been enrolled in 4-H for at least 2 years and must be enrolled in 4-H for the current year, must be or have been a Junior Leader or a Club Officer, must have an enthusiastic desire to serve and accept the responsibilities outlined in the Constitution and Handbook, and must submit to the selection process.
