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Record Book Reminders

Before turning in record books to club leaders, members and parents should both complete the checklist on the 'Criteria for an Up to Date Record Book for the Marias Fair' to ensure that the criteria for a 'Gold Seal of Excellence' is met. The 4-H member and parent should walk through this checklist, and if anything is missing, make sure to correct it before turning the book into the club leader or Extension office. This checklist is also available http://glacier.msuextension.org/4H.html. If this criteria is met, the member will receive a Gold Seal of Excellence and be eligible to compete in the Roundtable for top awards.

Resources - http://montana4h.org/resources/ has a guide that explains what should be recorded where (For the Record: A Guide for Completing 4-H Records), and fillable record book forms are also available.

Record Books

- **September 20** Final day to submit COMPLETED record book to receive completion recognition at Achievement Day
- September 29 Awards will be given for the Showcase interviews at Achievement Day, year-end completion certificates, member and leader recognition, etc.
- **September 30** Deadline for Completion All record books must be completed (according to the 'Criteria for an Up to Date Record Book') and turned in by September 30. If completion criteria is not met by September 30, members are not eligible to enroll in a market animal project or request any scholarship money from the Glacier County 4-H Council next year.
- National 4-H Week is October 6 12, the theme is Beyond Ready.
 - Clubs are encouraged to create a window display that can be up through 4-H Week (and October, ideally) showing how 4-H is Beyond Ready.
 - Wednesday, October 9 Wear your 4-H shirts to school
 - Clubs will receive a list of 4-H supporters to deliver goodies to during 4-H Week as a thank you for their support
 - Homecoming Parade 4-H clubs are invited to participate in the Homecoming parade
 - Locker decorating Ambassadors are planning to decorate middle school & high school

Our ambassadors are planning activities for Achievement Day, 4-H Week, Project Day, and within their clubs to help share the fun and excitement of 4-H.

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
Shooting Sports Trainings

Would you be interested in volunteering with archery, air rifle, air pistol, or shotgun? Trainings are coming up, please contact Kari for details. A certified leader is required to conduct practices and these are also an opportunity for youth leaders to become certified as well.

To be a certified leader in the State of Montana, must:

- Be at least 21 years of age.
- Be enrolled as a leader in their respective County. Passed a background check and successfully completed the Montana 4-H Volunteer Training Modules.
- All training attendees must complete the four National 4-H Shooting Sports modules on Z-Suites to be certified at the end of the practicum day. Please go to the 4-H Shooting Sports College at 4-hshootingsportscollege.com. The code for Z-Suites is NSS-MSU-FQ99W5JMD. Please see the attached instructions.
- Be trained and certified in any discipline(s) that they are teaching at the county level.
- Participants must attend the entire training and successfully complete all aspects to receive their respective discipline certification.
- Certification is good for seven (7) years. If the discipline is not taught in the first 2 years, the course must be retaken. To be a youth leader, youth need to be 14 or older.
- Local trainings include:
- Conrad September 20-21, 2024. We will offer Coordinator, Archery, Rifle, Pistol, and Shotgun
- Kalispell December 6-7, 2024. We will offer Coordinator, Archery, Rifle, Pistol, Muzzleloader, Hunting Skills, and Shotgun
