Risk and Protective Factors

- ► First Five Years: A complete course to address basic skills for new parents, caregivers, and early childhood staff training.
- ▶ 4th Edition: A comprehensive parenting program helping parents of kids ages 5 to 12 raise responsible, cooperative children who are able to resist negative peer pressure and thrive.
- ▶ Teens: A comprehensive program to help parents through the often-tumultuous years of 11-16. Each session also shows parents how to handle sensitive issues such as drugs, sexuality, and violence.

Target Populations

- Parents and caregivers of infants- 4 year olds
- ► Parents and caregivers of elementary age children (5 -12 year olds).
- Parents and caregivers of teens and preteens
- Parents and caregivers attend interested in developing their parenting skills. We have a variety of family types attending and some parents attend who do not have current custody of their children.

Level of Intervention

- Individual and Family
- Implemented in Home offered virtually at this time.
- Dosage of Active Parenting Zero to Five- 2 hours, 1 night a week, for 4 weeks
 Active Parenting 4th Edition (Elementary) and Teens- 2 hours, 1 night a week, for 6 weeks

Research Summary

- Over 35 Years of Active Parenting History provide strong scientific evidence of the efficacy of the active parenting model.
 - Caregiver participants reported positive change in
 - their own observation of their child or teens behavior,
 - their attitudes and beliefs about parenting,
 - ▶ their own parenting behavior (Foley et al., 2019) and
 - ▶ their parenting stress (Jespersen et al. 2021)
 - Caregiver participants reported their youth had positive changes in
 - Overall and prosocial behavior (Jespersen et al. 2021)
 - ► Long history with MSU Extension offering this program across 35 counties as far back as 1990 to help in addressing family skills need (Fulkwein, 1991)
